6) Updates by MTF members (20 mins):

a. AFDF updates (Decker) – PCSGA annual conference (Sept. 20-22); Ag Board vacancy

- Decker PCSGA annual conference will be held virtually on Sept. 20-22. Governor's office notified MTF that there is a vacancy on the Agriculture Board. Currently no aquatic farmers represented on the Board list of criteria states that you cannot serve on the Board if you have a pending loan or lease application under consideration. You can serve if it has been granted.
- b. Alaska Sea Grant updates (Eckert)
 - May 17-20, ASG will be holding a virtual Shellfish and Seaweed Festival, register on the ASG <u>website</u>. Chris Sannito, Melissa Good are working on developing methods for seaweed processing. Project underway titled, Developing Business Plans for Seaweed Aquaculture.
- c. NOAA updates (Bishop, Hollarsmith)
 - Bishop NOAA Office of Aquaculture will be holding an AOA update webinar on May 4, 11-11:30am AST. Register <u>here</u>. Last week received review comments from the Office of Aquaculture on the Alaska AOA challenges and opportunities outline. Next month, the Aquaculture Permitting Portal will be in final design.
 - Hollarsmith NOAA has been funded for two projects: One with Seagrove Kelp Co. to look at herring mitigation strategies; second project will address population genetic structure for kelp in SEAK. ASG fellow now working at the AFSC. Undergraduate at UW will be researching maps from 1915 of Alaska kelp beds to track changes.

d. ASGA updates (Wyatt)

- Wyatt last week, ASGA held an Alaska shellfish grower's roundtable. Current and potential new shellfish farmers all joined together. Sales have increased dramatically in the last few weeks. APHIS = FDA's Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service: <u>https://www.aphis.usda.gov/aphis/home/</u>. Very important for "biosecurity" of U.S. mariculture products.
- e. Other updates University conference (McCarty, Stekoll); ARPA request; comments to NOAA – "Making Fisheries, Aquaculture More Resilient to Climate Change" (McCarty); others.
 - McCarty upcoming conference hosted by Southeast Conference and JEDC in conjunction with UAF/UAS. Mariculture will be a major focus. Most likely in Juneau and in Spring 2022.
 - Stekoll planning in the beginning stages.
 - Decker ARPA request sent to the Governor's Office, Congressional Delegation, other committee members. Governor will be announcing how funds will be spent in the coming months. More discussion to come in May. \$51 million request: \$25 million to support the AMA/MRTC, \$25 million increase the MRLF, \$1 million to help support ASMI's marketing of mariculture products. Request mirrors some of the priorities in the Five-Year Action Plan.
 - McCarty comments submitted to NOAA: "Making Fisheries, Aquaculture More Resilient to Climate Change".

7) Workgroup Updates (15 mins):

a. Legislative Workgroup (McCarty, Rabung, Drobnica, Decker, Hetrick) – Update on mariculture bills (SB 64 / HB 41; HB 115) (McCarty, Decker)

- Decker SB 64 / HB 41. Senate Finance Committee amended SB 64, removing the ASMI marketing component. It was passed forward and will be awaiting a Senate floor vote. HB 41 was also amended ASMI's portion remains in the bill, however, now includes sunset clause in 2025, which puts industry on notice that an assessment mechanism must be in place to continue marketing after 2025. Shellfish enhancement portion of bill seems to remain intact. HB 115 DNR renewal process revisions (streamlining), reporting requirements, allows tourism & education activities at farms without additional fees the bill has a chance to pass this session.

8) Old Business (15 mins):

a. EVOS TC proposal - status report (Eckert)

- Eckert submitted on March 29. Expect to hear back in June, if invited, most likely will be asked to make revisions and resubmit in August. There is much coordination with farmers by ASG and AFDF; Total is \$25 million project over 10 years.
- b. AMA Workgroup report MRTC coordination & implementation, membership application, timeline (McCarty, Decker)
 - McCarty AMA workgroup had a meeting with Ginny and Melissa regarding coordination between the AMA and MRTC. As these entities evolve and the mission evolves.
 - Eckert revised the MRTC Whitepaper <u>here</u>. MRTC mission to build partnerships and leverage resources to facilitate and coordinate training, research and dissemination across disciplines (e.g. biology, engineering, economics, marketing, food sciences, etc.) for better success of industry and community development and to improve mariculture management.
 - Will be included in the draft AMA implementation plan. MRTC activities will be inclusive, will be administrated within the University with Alaska Sea Grant. ASG is a coordination between the University and NOAA. Mariculture Specialist has partial funding for upcoming fiscal year (25%).

• McCarty – list of potential AMA members has been drafted, membership application has been drafted, AMA 2-page glossy in development. Will be completed and membership drive will begin by mid-May.

Task: MTF will review MRTC Whitepaper and send suggestions to Eckert by April 30.

Task: AMA workgroup will send potential membership list to MTF for recommendations prior to membership drive.

9) New Business (60 mins):

- a. Final Report to the Governor review draft (McCarty)
 - McCarty extension was requested from the Governor's Office and granted new due date of May 15.
 - McCarty/Decker –Need to include an economic overview or progress status in report. We need input from the MTF on the Message from the MTF and content/appendices. May need to include an executive summary.
 - Eckert/Stekoll both the MRTC Whitepaper and Implementation Plan should be included.
 - Wyatt mariculture workforce development is a critical future need. We need more interested mariculture farmers. Training, outreach and education imperative.
 - Decker future needs section largely draws from Plan. Important for entire MTF to give feedback on new needs and challenges or ones that should be highlighted more from the Plan.

Task: entire MTF will review relevant portions of the final report and email suggestions to Decker/McCarty by April 30.

b. Army Corps of Engineers – presentation RE Nationwide General Permits (Andrew Gregory, Bryan Herczeg)

- Bishop would be great to widely circulate this information to new and potential farmers. Can you speak to the potential to implement a regional general permit for Alaska?
- Herczeg Nationwide General Permits (NGPs) are a rapid permitting process (45-60 days). Two different versions exist for aquatic farming/maricuture: #48 for commercial shellfish mariculture activities, #55 for seaweed and shellfish mariculture activities (also IMTA, or multiple species). Effective permitting tool, USACE is simply verifying that the activities are authorized. There was once a regional general permit in Alaska. If there are Alaska-centric needs not addressed in the NGPs, then USACE could explore developing one for Alaska. Need to hear from stakeholders and state agencies.
- Wyatt can an applicant challenge a condition of a NGP (i.e. no construction in winter because of humpback whale interaction)?
