



Recent History on Season Dates

Prior to Fall 2006, season extended to April 15

- Shortened to March 15 due to decline in population and concern for high spring harvest
 - Airplane based hunters utilizing ski landings (SDA allowed up through 2006)
 - Snowmobiles dispersing from villages



Status of Mulchatna Herd

- Presently ~26,000
- Composition and reproductive indices are trending upward
- Current reported harvest is well below sustainable level

Tracking Harvest and Effort

- Fall 2013 registration permit (RC503) replaces harvest ticket
 - Improves our ability to track harvest and effort
 - Five day reporting period provides timely harvest updates
 - First year of data (RY2013), 89% reported




Winter Hunt History

- Initiated in 2003: RM575-one antlered bull
 - Dec. 1 Jan 31 (a 14 day season may be announced)

- At 2013 BOG, two changes were adopted
 - Bag limit was increased to two moose
 - Discretionary authority to issue bull and cow permits

Summary

Longer season provides greater likelihood of hunter success

Moose are at or above population objective


- RM587 adopted by board in 2005 to address crowding and hunter conflicts
- Department uses discretionary authority to require orientation and limit where permits are available
- Permit requires hunters to view two videos, "Is This Moose Legal" and "Meat Care" prior to getting permit
- Hunters are also required to fill out a non-resident corridor orientation checklist at counter prior to getting permit

Summary

Finding and training dedicated vendors in villages is a very difficult task

Unit 17 Brown Bear Hunting Regulations

- Two bears every regulatory year for resident and nonresident hunters
- Season dates are Aug 20 May 31
- No permit or harvest ticket required except for the subsistence hunt for resident hunters
- No resident locking tag required


Baiting of brown bears under 5 AAC 92.044 is not legal in Unit 17

> 5 AAC 92.210 is a statewide regulation that prohibits the use of a carcass of "game" that died of natural causes for bait if that carcass is moved from where it was found


Proposed change - reduce bag limit from 2 to 1 bears per regulatory year:

- > The bag limit was changed from 1 to 2 bears in 2011
- > The department supported this action

Summary

- The department does not have concerns with the 2 bear/year bag limit
- Baiting of brown bears is allowed in many Units, although none adjacent to Unit 17

- ➤ If board chooses to adopt this proposal as intended by proponent, it must be amend proposal to change bag limit from two bears to one per regulatory year
