Prince William Sound Salmon Fishery Announcement #7

COPPER RIVER DISTRICT: The Copper River District will remain closed to commercial fishing. Permit holders are advised that the Copper River commercial fishery may open on short notice should indices of sockeye salmon abundance support fishing. A minimum of 17 hours advance notice of a fishery opening is anticipated. The next commercial opening of the Copper River District may occur as early as Thursday, June 3 with time and area announced on Wednesday, June 2.

To date, the sonar count is the 13th lowest on record (1978-2021). Cumulative commercial harvest this year is the 4th lowest harvest to-date in the last 50 years. Cumulative sonar count through 5/31 is 54,154 fish, whereas 132,531 fish are projected by this date to meet the Inriver Run Goal. The 0600 count for 6/1 is 2,149 fish. The Prince William Sound Science Center's Lower Copper River Sonar Station is operational near the mouth of Clear Martin River on the lower east side of the Copper River (60° 22.48' N., 144° 53.68' W.) and fish passage summaries can be viewed at <https://pwssc.org/2021-lower-copper-sonar/>.

Under Alaska's Health Advisories 1, 2, 3, and 4, commercial fishing is an Essential Business and is part of Alaska's Essential Services and Critical Infrastructure. Commercial fishermen should ensure that all travel and other activities in support of commercial fishing operations follow protocols in Alaska COVID19 Health Advisories. Unless otherwise specified, all openings are clock openings based on Alaska Daylight Time, which is based on Coordinated Universal Time and may be obtained by calling 303-499-7111.

The department encourages commercial permit holders to renew their licenses early and to check their CFEC vessel registration stickers to make sure they are current.

The department also encourages permit holders to report observed violations to Wildlife Safeguard at 800-478-3377. Reports are anonymous and cash rewards may be paid for successful prosecution of violations.
