Prince William Sound Salmon Fishery Announcement #22

<u>COPPER RIVER DISTRICT</u>: The Copper River District will open at 7:00 am on Monday, July 5 for a 24-hour commercial drift gillnet fishing period. Waters within the **standard Chinook salmon inside closure area** will be <u>**OPEN**</u> during this fishing period. Daily and cumulative passage at the Miles Lake sonar station indicates that the inriver goal is likely to be met and supports opening the Copper River District commercial fishery. Copper River District Chinook salmon average harvest timing (2011-2020) is 99% complete through this date.

During the commercial fishing season, subsistence harvest may occur in the Copper River District concurrent in time and area with commercial fishing periods until the Copper River District is closed at the end of the season. Additionally, waters of the Copper River District, **including** the standard Chinook salmon inside closure area, will open to subsistence fishing from 6:00 am to 10:00 pm on all Saturdays between July 4 and October 31.

The grass bank marker line is defined in 5AAC 24.350(1)(A) with the exception of this year's extension of the closure line across Little Softuk (**see bold font below**). This closure line is defined with the following points:

Waters north of this line, within sloughs, and in Boswell Bay within the bay (5 AAC 24.350 (1)(A)) are closed to commercial and subsistence salmon fishing <u>during all periods</u>.

Subsistence users may obtain subsistence permits during regular business hours. Prince William Sound Management Area salmon subsistence permits may be obtained through any ADF&G office or online (https://www.adfg.alaska.gov/Store/). In Cordova, permits will be available during normal business hours Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. and 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. ADF&G staff will not be available to issue permits before hours, after hours, on state holidays, or on weekends. Permit holders are encouraged the Cordova 907-424-3212 to call office at report online or

(<u>https://www.adfg.alaska.gov/Harvest/</u>) to provide preliminary harvest reports to assist with inseason harvest tracking.

Cumulative sonar count through 7/2 is 506,427 fish, whereas 429,733 fish are projected by this date to meet the Inriver Run Goal. The 0600 count for 7/3 is 4,039 fish. For the week ending July 3, the Copper River Delta survey count was 27,550 sockeye salmon versus an anticipated range of 28,229 - 66,722. This survey was impacted by poor survey conditions that likely resulted in reduced counts relative to actual abundance. The Copper River District harvest for the 36-hour fishing period that started on Thursday, July 1 was 28,200 sockeye and 41 Chinook salmon with 190 deliveries reported.

BERING RIVER DISTRICT: The Bering River District will remain closed to commercial fishing. For the week ending July 3, the Bering River Delta survey count was 4,650 sockeye salmon versus an anticipated range of 6,092 – 13,402.

PRINCE WILLIAM SOUND GILLENT FISHERIES: Gillnet depth restrictions, as specified in 5 AAC 24.331(b)(6), **WILL NOT BE IN EFFECT** in the Coghill District, Eshamy District, and Unakwik District fisheries starting 8:00 am, Monday, July 5.

COGHILL DISTRICT: The Coghill District, excluding waters of the Esther, Granite Bay, and Bettles Bay subdistricts and waters of the WNH SHA and THA, will open to commercial drift gillnet harvest for a 36-hour period starting at 8:00 am on Monday, July 5. Waters of Granite Bay Subdistrict, within Esther Passage and on the western side of Esther Island north of a latitude line at 60° 49.02' N., will open to commercial drift gillnet harvest for a 60-hour period starting at 8:00 am on Monday, July 5. Waters of Esther Subdistrict east of a line from **60° 48.22' N., 147° 57.05' W. to 60° 45.02' N., 147° 58.75' W.** will open to commercial drift gillnet harvest for a 60-hour period starting at 8:00 am on Monday, July 5. Waters of Port Wells and College Fiord, north of 60° 55.81' N., and east of a line from Pakenham Point (61° 00.45' N., 148° 04.85' W.) to 60° 55.81' N., 148° 10.92' W., will open to commercial drift gillnet harvest for a 60-hour period starting to the Coghill River, as specified in 5 AAC 24.350(6)(B)), will not be in effect for this fishing period. Commercial fishing will not be permitted within the bed or channel of the Coghill River at any stage of the tide. Preliminary harvest estimates from the 36-hour period that started on Monday, June 28 were 133,000 chum and 23,400 sockeye salmon with 826 deliveries reported. As of July 2, 21,898 sockeye salmon have passed the Coghill River weir versus a cumulative anticipated range of 6,200 – 18,600 fish.

PWSAC requests that a portion of the Esther and Granite Bay subdistricts, and the WNH SHA and THA remain closed for all of the 60-hour commercial fishing period commencing on Monday, July 5. PWSAC completed its preseason WNH chum salmon cost recovery goal and is now in the process of securing broodstock. **In response to COVID-19, all PWSAC facilities are closed to the public until further notice.**

ESHAMY DISTRICT: The Eshamy District will remain closed. Preliminary harvest estimates from the 12-hour period that started on Thursday, July 1 were 14,200 chum and 45,600 sockeye salmon with 326 deliveries reported.

PWSAC requests that the Eshamy District remain closed. Cost recovery harvests will continue in the Main Bay Subdistrict as run entry and hatchery escapement warrants. In response to COVID-19, all PWSAC facilities are closed to the public until further notice.

<u>UNAKWIK DISTRICT</u>: The Unakwik District will open to commercial drift gillnet and purse seine harvest for a 24-hour period starting at 8:00 am on Monday, July 5.

SEINE FISHERIES: VFDA began its cost recovery sales program on Thursday, July 1 and has collected approximately 2% of the assigned pink salmon revenue goal through July 2. Cost recovery pink salmon harvest in Port Valdez on Friday, July 2, resulted in an average weight of 3.7 pounds per fish and 13% female. VFDA cost recovery is continuing today.

An aerial survey of portions of the Eastern District was conducted on July 29. Stream escapement observations were minimal during these surveys, which is to be expected for the date. Current indices of escapement and run entry do not support a purse seine CPF targeting wild stocks in the Eastern District. The next aerial survey of the Eastern and Northern Districts is expected to occur tomorrow, July 4.

MONTAGUE DISTRICT: The Port Chalmers Subdistrict, **north of 60°12.56' N. lat. and east of a line from 60° 12.56'N., 147° 20.25'W. to 60° 20.00'N., 147° 14.30'W.,** will open to purse seine fishing for 48 hours beginning at 8:00 am on Monday, July 5. A regular schedule of three fishing periods per week is anticipated to remain in effect until further notice. **Regulatory closed waters and anadromous stream closures within the Port Chalmers Subdistrict will not be in effect until further notice.** A total of 320,000 chum salmon are forecast to return to Port Chalmers. Harvest estimates from the 36-hour period that ended yesterday, July 2, was 32,882 chum salmon and 20,112 pink salmon with 47 deliveries. Pink salmon contribution estimates from the period ending Wednesday, June 30 was 34% SGH, and 66% wild.

SOUTHWESTERN DISTRICT: The AFK Hatchery **SHA** will open to purse seine fishing for 24 hours beginning at 8:00 am on Monday, July 5. A regular schedule of three fishing periods per week is anticipated to remain in effect until further notice. **Regulatory closed waters and anadromous stream closures within the AFK Hatchery SHA will not be in effect until further notice.** A total of 150,000 chum salmon are forecast to return to AFK.Hatchery. Preliminary harvest estimates from the 24-hour period that ended yesterday, July 2, was 24,325 chum salmon, and 4,435 sockeye salmon with 31 deliveries reported. Chum salmon contribution estimates from the period ending Tuesday, June 29 was 91% AFK, 2% WNH, 6% Port Chalmers, and 2% wild. Sockeye salmon contribution estimates from that same period was 89% MBH, and 11% wild.
