2025 Cook Inlet Area State-Waters Pacific Cod Season Opening for Pot Gear Emergency Order # 2-GF-H-03-25

The Cook Inlet Area (CI) Pacific cod parallel season will close to vessels using pot gear at 12:00 noon on February 7 and the state-waters season will open to vessels using pot gear at 12:00 noon on February 8. The guideline harvest level (GHL) for the CI Pacific cod state-waters pot season is 1,441,005 pounds of which 423,825 pounds is available to vessels greater than 58 feet in length. The parallel season will remain open to jig and longline gear. There is a 24-hour delivery time requirement following closure of a groundfish fishery. All fish harvested in the parallel pot season must be landed prior to participating in the state-waters pot season. All groundfish pot gear must be removed from the water, except as provided in 5 AAC 28.332.

In the state-waters pot season no more than 60 groundfish pots may be operated from a vessel, pots may not be longlined, and each pot must display a buoy identification tag. Bycatch limits by species or species aggregate for CI are set by Emergency Order 2-GF-H-01-25 and may be found in the Central Region Groundfish Fisheries Outlook Advisory Announcement.

Area registration for the state-waters pot season is exclusive and registrations may be obtained through ADF&G offices in Homer, Cordova, Anchorage, Soldotna, and Kodiak or by appointment in Seward (contact Homer ADF&G office) and buoy tags may be obtained at Homer, Anchorage, and Seward ADF&G offices or by mail.




Figure 1. Kachemak Bay groundfish pot closure area with boundary coordinates and statistical areas.

Pot fishing closure areas: Pacific cod may be taken in waters of CI except for groundfish pot closure areas within Kachemak Bay (5 AAC 28.350; Figure 1).

Steller Sea Lion Rookery closures: Directed fishing for all groundfish species is closed in waters within 10 nautical miles of two Steller sea lion rookeries within CI (Figure 1). 


Figure 2. Vessel no-transit and fixed gear Pacific cod fishing closure zones around Steller sea lion rookeries within the Cook Inlet Area.
