2025 Yukon River Salmon Summer Fishery Announcement #9 District 3 and Innoko River Closure of 4-inch mesh gillnets

Districts Affected: Lower Yukon Area

The 2025 Chinook salmon run size is forecasted to be well below average and is expected to be similar in size to last year. It is unlikely that any escapement goals will be met in Alaska or Canada. To protect Chinook salmon as they migrate upriver, 4-inch or smaller mesh gillnets are being closed from the first quarter point to third quarter point of the run to protect the bulk of the Chinook salmon run. Quarter point dates are based on historical run timing from recent years.

During this closure, nonlethal or selective gear types for nonsalmon may still be used, including hook and line, dip net, beach seine, hand line, longline, and fyke net. Pink and sockeye salmon may be retained. Chinook and summer chum salmon must be released alive.

If the summer chum salmon run is projected to exceed the drainagewide minimum escapement goal of 500,000 fish, openings with selective gear types will be announced.

Subsistence Management Actions

To protect Chinook salmon all gillnets (including 4-inch or smaller mesh gear) must be removed from the water during the bulk of the run.

District 3 (including Russian Mission and Holy Cross):

Chinook and chum salmon fishing is closed. Fishing for nonsalmon is currently open 24 hours a day, seven days per week with 4-inch or smaller mesh gillnets and other nonsalmon gear types.

Effective 8 p.m. Saturday, June 21 until 8 p.m. Tuesday, July 8, <u>all gillnets</u> must be removed from the water.

Fishing for nonsalmon is still allowed 24 hours a day, seven days per week during this period, but it is limited to nonlethal or selective gear types including hook and line with a rod or pole, dip net, beach seine, hand line, longline, and fyke net. Pink and sockeye salmon may be retained. Chinook and chum salmon must be released alive.

Innoko River (including Shageluk):

Chinook and chum salmon fishing is closed. Fishing for nonsalmon is currently open 24 hours a day, seven days per week with 4-inch or smaller mesh gillnets and other nonsalmon gear types.

Effective 8 p.m. Monday, June 23 until 8 p.m. Thursday, July 10, <u>all gillnets</u> must be removed from the water.

Fishing for nonsalmon is still allowed 24 hours a day, seven days per week during this period, but it is limited to nonlethal or selective gear types including hook and line with a rod or pole, dip net, beach seine, hand line, longline, and fyke net. Pink and sockeye salmon may be retained. Chinook and chum salmon must be released alive.

Federal Special Action

The Alaska Department of Fish and Game (ADF&G) and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) have coordinated on this advisory announcement. The USFWS Federal Inseason Manager has issued a separate Fishery special action FSA 2-KS-07-25 closing all gillnets in waters adjacent to Federal Land.
