KODIAK COMMERCIAL SALMON FISHERY ADVISORY ANNOUNCEMENT #08 For Emergency Order #4-FS-K-08-25

The Izhut Bay Section of the Afognak District will <u>close</u> to commercial salmon fishing at 9:00 p.m. Monday, June 30.

As previously announced:

<u>Cost recovery fisheries</u> began in the Spiridon Bay Special Harvest Area (SHA) at 12:01 a.m. Sunday, June 29 and the Spiridon Bay SHA will remain <u>closed</u> to common property fishing. Fishery opportunities in the Spiridon Bay SHA will be dependent on the ability to meet KRAA cost recovery needs. Cost recovery information can be obtained by calling 486-6559.

The following areas remain open until further notice:

- The Duck Bay Section of the Afognak District; and
- The Foul Bay Special Harvest Area.

Fishermen are reminded that in the Kodiak Area (including the Mainland District) until further notice, Chinook (king) salmon 28 inches or greater in length may not be retained by purse seine gear in the commercial fishery and must be returned to the water unharmed.

Closed Water Adjustments:

Closed waters are **reduced** at **Foul Bay** to the stream terminus at Hidden Lake Creek (stream #251-406).

In response to the recent record-low Chinook salmon escapements in the Karluk River, commercial salmon fishing in the Inner Karluk and Outer Karluk Sections of the Southwest Kodiak District, the Northwest Kodiak District, and the Southwest Afognak Section of the Afognak District will remain closed from June 1 through July 5. Fishing will resume only after the Karluk River's early-run sockeye salmon escapement goal of 150,000 to 250,000 fish is exceeded.

In response to the recent record-low Chinook salmon escapements in the Ayakulik River, commercial salmon fishing in the Inner Ayakulik, Outer Ayakulik, and Halibut Bay Sections of the Southwest Kodiak District will remain closed from June 1 through July 15. Fishing will resume only after the Ayakulik River's early-run sockeye salmon escapement goal of 140,000 to 280,000 fish is exceeded.

Other closed waters are as shown on the Kodiak Area Salmon Statistical Chart and detailed in the Commercial Salmon Fishing Regulations (5AAC 18.350). Statistical Charts, Harvest Strategies, and Commercial Salmon
