Lower Cook Inlet Salmon Fishery Advisory Announcement #21

SOUTHERN DISTRICT: Purse seine: In the Southern District, the following areas remain open on a schedule of Monday, Wednesday, and Friday 16-hour commercial fishing periods beginning at 6:00 AM on those days,

-the Halibut Cove Subdistrict,

-the Tutka Bay Subdistrict, excluding the Tutka Bay Hatchery special harvest area (SHA) southeast of a line between a point at 59° 28.22' N. Lat., 151° 27.85' W. Long., and another point at 59° 28.76' N. Lat., 151° 26.75' W. Long., and

-the Neptune Bay and China Poot Bay sections, excluding the Hazel Lake and China Poot SHAs. Purse seine harvest through July 31 from the Southern District is estimated at 202,000 sockeye, 550 pink, 170 chum, 90 coho, and 2 Chinook salmon.

Set gillnet: Waters of the Southern District identified in 5AAC 21.330(b)(1) remain open to commercial set gillnet harvest on a regular schedule of two 48-hour fishing periods per week beginning at 6:00 AM on Mondays and Thursdays as defined in 5AAC 21.320(a)(3). Harvest from last week's fishing periods are shown in Table 1,

OUTER DISTRICT: The following subdistricts remain open on a schedule of daily sixteen-hour fishing periods from 6:00 AM to 10:00 PM, the Dogfish (Koyuktolik) Bay Subdistrict, the Windy Bay Subdistrict, and the Rocky Bay Subdistrict. In addition, the portion of the Nuka Island Subdistrict in the Petrof area north and west of a point at 59° 20.00' N. latitude., 150° 48.00' W. longitude, and the portion of the East Nuka Subdistrict north of 59° 33.60' N. latitude are open on a schedule of daily sixteen-hour fishing periods beginning at 6:00 AM on those days. Purse seine harvest from the Outer District through July 31 is estimated at 26,000 pink, 13,500 chum, 2,500 sockeye, 13 Chinook, and 5 coho salmon.

EASTERN DISTRICT: Waters of the Aialik Bay Subdistrict remain open to commercial common property purse seine harvest on a daily schedule of 6:00 AM to 10:00 PM fishing periods. This includes the waters of Petersen (Aialik) Lagoon south of 59° 53.84' N. latitude.

KAMISHAK DISTRICT: Subdistricts of the Kamishak District excluding the McNeil River Subdistrict, and the Paint River Subdistrict remain open on a daily schedule of 24-hour fishing periods. Regulatory closed waters restrictions that pertain to the Iniskin Subdistrict (5AAC 21.350(e)(3)) are suspended until further notice. Commercial salmon fishing is permitted in Iniskin Bay south of 59° 46.30' N. latitude on a schedule concurrent with other areas in the Kamishak District. The portion of Chenik Lagoon east of 154° 08.33' W. long. is open on a schedule of daily 24-hour fishing periods. The Chenik video counting station has documented 11,890 salmon entering Chenik Lake towards an SEG range of 2,900 – 13,700 fish. Purse seine harvest from the Kamishak District through July 31 is estimated at 77,000 sockeye, 20,000 pink, and 2,500 chum salmon.

As a reminder, unless otherwise specified in regulation or by emergency order, commercial fishing for salmon is prohibited at all times within 500 yards of the fresh water of a salmon stream and over the beds or channels of streams and rivers at all stages of the tide. Fresh water is considered separated from salt water, at the mouth of streams and rivers, by a line drawn between the seaward extremities of the exposed tideland banks at the present stage of the tide, (5AAC 39.975(a)(26)).

The next scheduled commercial salmon fisheries announcement is anticipated to be on Friday, August 8.
