Section 1-B: will be open from 12:01 p.m., Sunday, August 31, through 12:00 noon, Thursday, September 4, 2025, with the following restriction:

Pearse and Portland Canals: will be closed north of the latitude of Akeku Point at 54°50.03′ N lat.

District 6: will be open from 12:01 p.m., Sunday, August 31, through 12:00 noon, Wednesday, September 3, 2025, with the following restriction:

Section 6-D: will be closed.

District 8: will be open from 12:01 p.m., Sunday, August 31, through 12:00 noon, Wednesday, September 3, 2025, with the following restrictions:
