



Advisory Announcement

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SOUTHEAST ALASKA RED AND BLUE KING CRAB PERSONAL USE FISHERY

The Southeast Alaska personal use red (RKC) and blue king crab (BKC) fishery outside of Section 11-A is updated with the following information regarding the 2026/2027 season:

- All areas open to personal use king crab fishing will have a daily bag and possession limit of three RKC or BKC [5 AAC 77.664(b)]. The 2025 stock assessment survey results estimated 211,573 pounds of legal male RKC available for commercial harvest, which is greater than the minimum threshold of 200,000 pounds [5 AAC 77.664(b)], warranting an increase in daily bag and possession limits for personal use.
- Peril Strait, Lynn Sisters, Pybus Bay, and Excursion Inlet will remain closed to RKC and BKC personal use fishing.
- When RKC/BKC and golden king crab areas are open at the same time there is a maximum bag and possession limit of three king crab in combination of species.
- Alaska residents fishing for RKC and BKC must have an Alaska Department of Fish and Game (department) 2026/2027 Southeast Alaska Regional Personal Use King Crab Permit (excluding Section 11-A RKC and BKC) [5 AAC 77.664(a)].

The personal use permit is free and available through the department's online store at: www.adfg.alaska.gov/Store/. Personal use fishers must sign their permit to make it valid and have the permit, along with a current sport fishing license, in their possession while taking part in personal use king crab fisheries in Southeast Alaska. Regional personal use king crab permits are valid for RKC and BKC in all open areas except Section 11-A, which is managed under a separate permit. Permits must be filled out each time king crab pots or ring nets are retrieved (or dive gear is used) whether king crab are harvested or not, before leaving the fishing area. Permit holders are required to report their harvest either online any time at: <https://www.adfg.alaska.gov/Harvest/> or by turning in the completed permit at the end of the season.

2025 Survey and Fishery Information

Personal use RKC and BKC fisheries are closed in all areas of Southeast Alaska by regulation from April 1 through June 30 [5 AAC 77.664(c)(1)] annually to protect crab during the molting and mating season. From July 1 through March 31, open fishing periods for the personal use RKC and BKC fisheries may be adjusted by emergency order. The department conducts a RKC and BKC stock assessment survey in seven areas throughout Southeast Alaska including: the Juneau area (Section 11-A), Lynn Sisters, Excursion Inlet, Pybus Bay, Gambier Bay, Seymour Canal, and Peril Strait. Surveys begin in late June/early July and conclude in August. Information from the surveys is used to manage commercial and personal use RKC and BKC fisheries. The remaining waters of Southeast Alaska outside the areas surveyed are referred to as "non-surveyed" areas. Information and trends from the surveyed areas are used to infer management decisions for non-surveyed areas.

Due to the 2026 RKC and BKC stock assessment survey not being completed on July 1, 2026, decisions regarding the personal use RKC and BKC fisheries are initially based on 2025 stock assessment survey results.

Juneau Area, Section 11-A

Status of the summer RKC and BKC personal use fishery within Section 11-A is scheduled for August 2026, specific dates will be addressed in a separate advisory announcement to be issued later. Closed Area Descriptions

- **Peril Strait:** Section 13-C, waters of the district north of the latitude of Pogibshi Point at 57°30.50' N lat and west of a line from the southeasternmost tip of Point Hayes at 57°28.83' N lat, 134°50.33' W long, to the northernmost tip of Point Thatcher at 57°24.97' N lat, 134°50.00' W long (all waters of Peril Strait including Hoonah Sound, Ushk Bay, Rodman Bay, Saook Bay, Hanus Bay, Sitkoh Bay, and contiguous waters west of a line from Point Hayes to Point Thatcher, and north of a line from Pogibshi Point due west to the Chichagof shoreline).
- **Lynn Sisters:** Waters north of a line from a point at 58°27.00' N lat, 135°06.50' W long, due east to a point at 58°27.00' N lat, 135°03.00' W long, and west of a line from a point at 58°27.00' N lat, 135°03.00' W long, to Point Whidbey at 58°34.65' N lat, 135°08.69' W long, including St. James Bay.
- **Pybus Bay/Little Pybus/Round Rock Area:** This area is defined as all waters of statistical area 110-22 and includes waters north of a line from 57°12.40' N lat, 134°09.47' W long, to a point in Frederick Sound at 57°12.61' N lat, 133°52.86' W long, and east of a line from a point in Frederick Sound at 57°12.61' N lat, 133°52.86' W long, to a point on the Admiralty Island Coast at 57°18.40' N lat, 133°57.80' W long.
- **Excursion Inlet:** Waters east of a line from a point at 58°22.57' N lat, 135°30.08' W long, south to a point at 58°19.28' N lat, 135°30.06' W long, and north of a line from a point at 58°19.28' N lat, 135°30.06' W long to a point at 58°16.13' N lat, 135°20.61' W long, including Excursion Inlet.

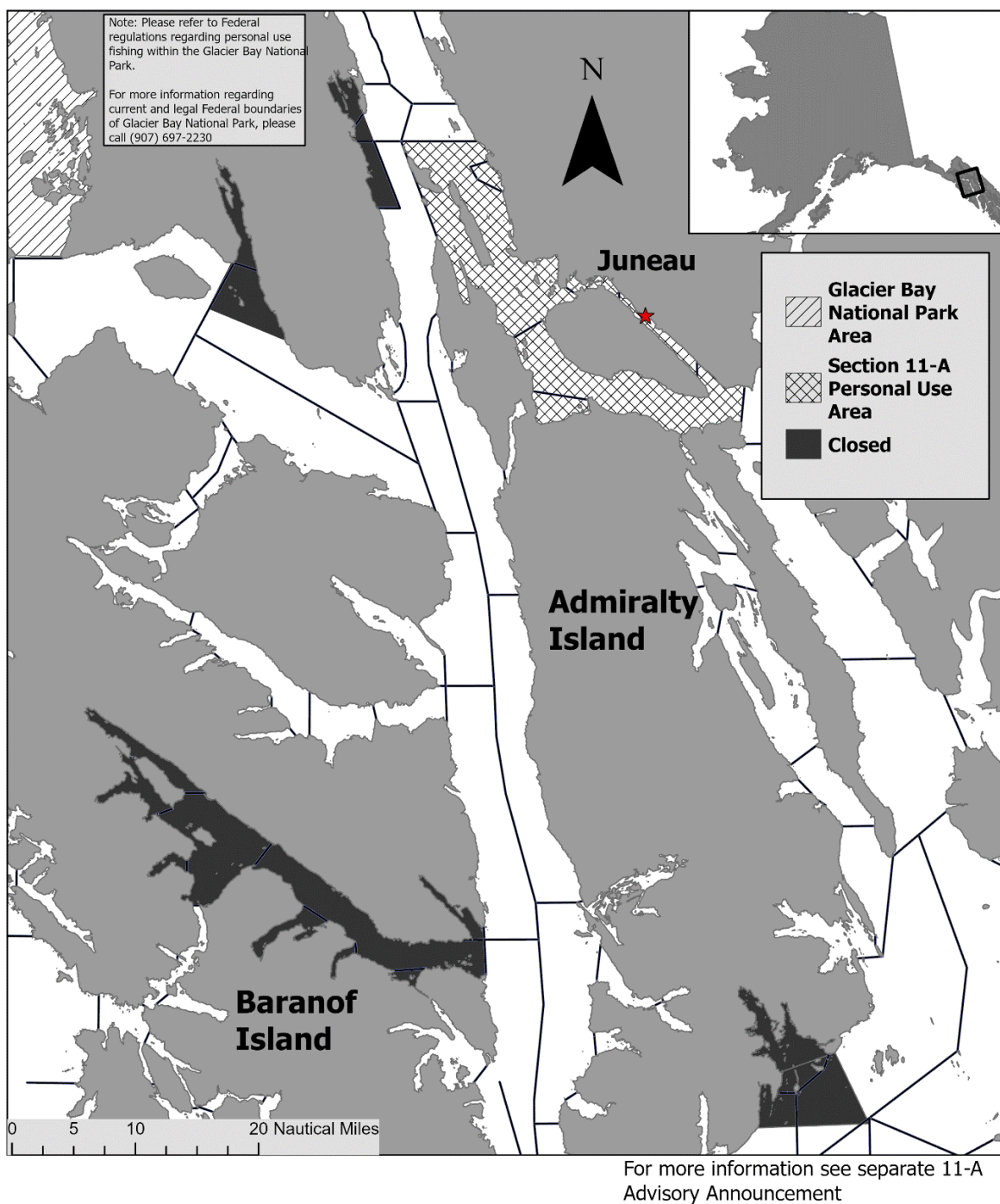


Figure 1.—Areas closed for the 2026/2027 RKC and BKC personal use fishery and is for reference purposes only. Refer to text in this advisory announcement for legal descriptions of management area boundaries and other details.

Refer to Figure 1 showing open and closed waters for personal use RKC and BKC fishing.

Other Information

A personal use fishing permit issued by the department is required to take king crab for each household; households may not be issued multiple permits of the same type per year. A permit holder or a household member listed on the permit must have the permit in possession when fishing. The fishing report section of your permit must be submitted online or returned to the ADF&G Regional Office before June 23, 2027, even if you did not fish. Fishery participants are reminded that male RKC and BKC must be seven inches or greater in width of shell to be retained [5 AAC 77.664(d)]. Male king crab less than the minimum legal size and female king crab must be immediately returned to the water unharmed.

When reporting the harvest, please include the statistical area of the fishing location, this can be found on the maps included with the permit as well as on the online harvest tool.

For the areas open to personal use king crab fishing outside of Section 11-A, **no more than 4 pots or 10 ring nets per vessel may be used for king and Tanner crab.** A pot used to take king crab must have at least two escape rings on opposing vertical or sloping sides of the pot that are not less than six and one-quarter inches inside diameter. Each user shall plainly and legibly inscribe the fisher's first initial, last name, and home address on a keg or buoy attached to a pot. A keg or buoy attached to the pot must also be inscribed with the vessel name or the division of motor vehicles registration number (AK number) of the vessel used to operate the pot [5 AAC 77.010 and 5 AAC 77.664(h)].
