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Lower Cook Inlet Salmon Fishery Advisory Announcement #2

SOUTHERN DISTRICT: Purse seine: In the Southern District, the following areas will open for 16-hour commercial purse seine fishing periods on Monday June 8, Wed. June 10, and Friday June 12 from 6:00 AM to 10:00 PM on those days. Those open areas are,

- the Tutka Bay Subdistrict, excluding the Tutka Bay Hatchery special harvest area (SHA), and
- the Halibut Cove Subdistrict, and China Poot and Neptune Bay sections, excluding the Hazel Lake and China Poot SHAs.

The Northshore Subdistrict and all other areas of the Southern District remain closed to commercial purse seine salmon harvest. The map below shows the location where the Halibut Cove Subdistrict, the Northshore Subdistrict, and the China Poot and Neptune Bay sections converge, (5AAC 21.200(d)(6), (7), and (8)).

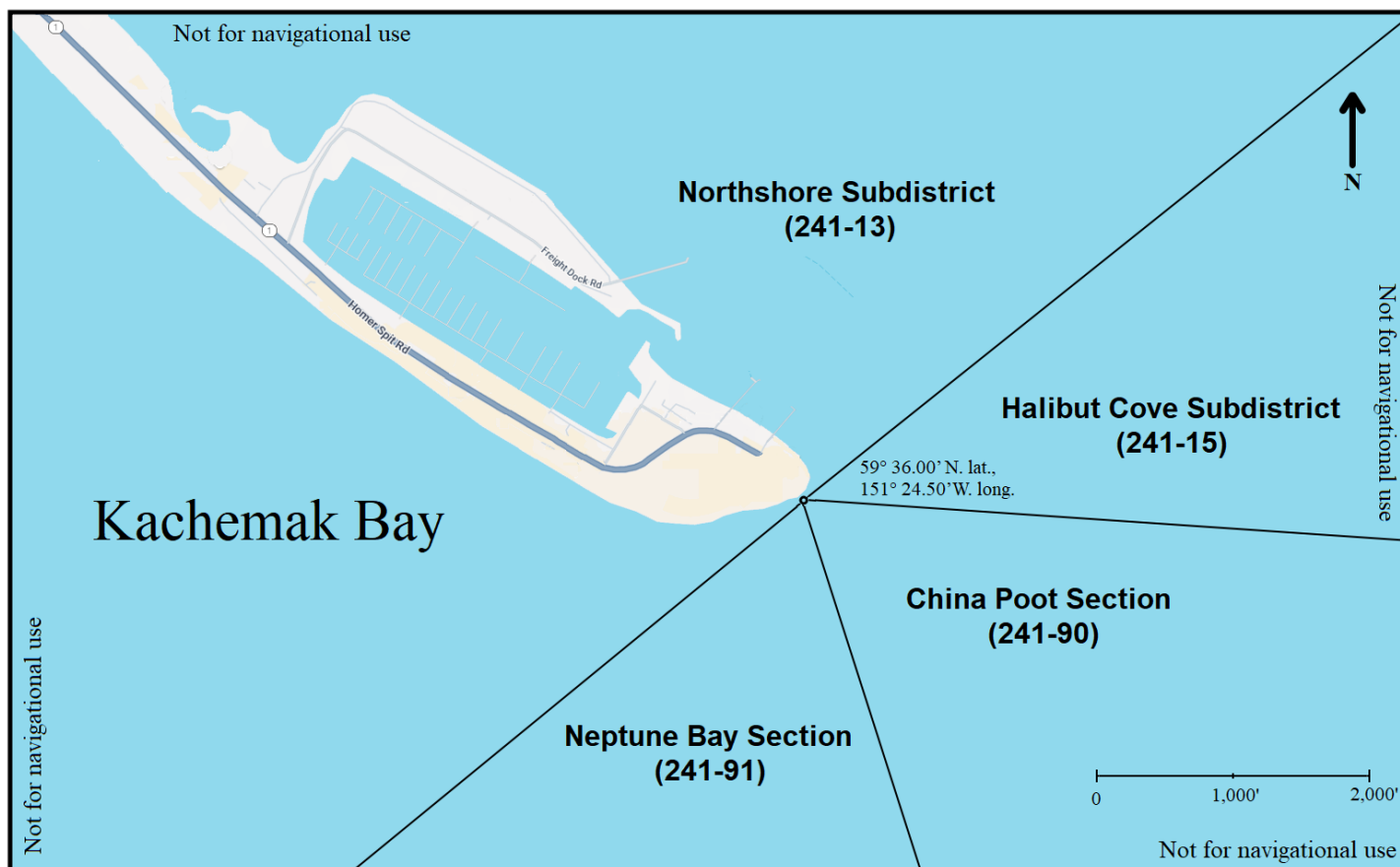


Figure 1.- Terminus of the Homer Spit showing general intersections of Halibut Cove and Northshore subdistricts, and Neptune Bay and China Poot sections of the China Poot Subdistrict as defined in 5AAC 21.200(d).

Set gillnet: Waters of the Southern District identified in 5AAC 21.330(b)(1) remain open to commercial set gillnet harvest on a regular schedule of two 48-hour fishing periods per week beginning at 6:00 AM on Mondays and Thursdays as defined in 5AAC 21.320(a)(3). Harvest from the 48-hour fishing period that began at 6:00 AM on Monday, June 1 was 390 sockeye, 9 Chinook, and 5 chum salmon. Last year's harvest from the first fishing period was 210 sockeye, 4 Chinook, and 203 chum salmon. The previous five-year average harvest for this period is 403 sockeye, 12 Chinook, and 53 chum salmon.

KAMISHAK DISTRICT: Subdistricts of the Kamishak District as defined in 5AAC 21.200(e), remain closed to commercial common property salmon harvest. Waters of the Chenik Subdistrict may open to salmon purse seine harvest in mid-June. Sockeye salmon escapement monitoring into Chenik Lake is anticipated to begin in the coming weeks using satellite relayed video.

As a reminder, unless otherwise specified in regulation or by emergency order, commercial fishing for salmon is prohibited at all times within 500 yards of the fresh water of a salmon stream and over the beds or channels of streams and rivers at all stages of the tide. Fresh water is considered separated from salt water, at the mouth of streams and rivers, by a line drawn between the seaward extremities of the exposed tideland banks at the present stage of the tide, (5AAC 39.975(a)(26)).

Hatchery: A total of 84,000 sockeye salmon are anticipated to return to Resurrection Bay release sites in 2026. Hatchery cost recovery began on May 21. The Bear Creek weir has passed 1,463 sockeye salmon through 6/4. This is below the 1,896 fish anticipated for this date to achieve a final escapement of 12,000 fish that are required to meet broodstock needs and provide for wild stock escapement.

The next scheduled commercial salmon fisheries announcement is anticipated to be on Friday, June 12.
