## 2026/27 Alaska Weathervane Scallop Guideline Harvest Levels

The 2026/27 weathervane scallop fisheries in the Yakutat, Prince William Sound (PWS; West Kayak Subsection only), Kodiak, Alaska Peninsula, Dutch Harbor, and Bristol Bay-Bering Sea Areas will open on July 1, 2026. The Cook Inlet Area and PWS East Kayak Subsection will be closed for the 2026/27 season. Guideline harvest levels (GHLs) and crab bycatch limits for the 2026/27 scallop season are listed below.

Vessel operators must obtain separate scallop interim-use dredge gear permit cards for state and federal waters from the Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission (CFEC) and a vessel registration from the Alaska Department of Fish and Game (ADF&G) prior to participating in the scallop fishery. Vessels are required to have an activated vessel monitoring system (VMS) onboard and to carry an onboard observer during all fishing activity. Vessels may not operate more than two dredges at one time and dredges may not be more than 15 feet wide.

ADF&G will assess inseason fishery performance as measured by catch per unit effort (CPUE) and monitor crab bycatch. Poor fishery performance or excessive crab bycatch may result in area, or partial area, closures prior to achieving the full GHLL.

Area specific scallop fishery, survey, and stock status information is presented in the *Stock Assessment and Fishery Evaluation Report for the Scallop Fishery off Alaska (April 2026)* published by the North Pacific Fishery Management Council (NPFMC) which may be found here:
