Kuskokwim Bay Fishery Announcement #4

District 4 Commercial Fishery

Emergency Order #3-S-WB-03-26

This is an announcement from the Alaska Department of Fish and Game (ADF&G) for commercial fishermen in District W4, Quinhagak.

Sockeye salmon run strengths in the Kuskokwim area have been increasing over the last 20 years. While Chinook salmon run strengths have been lower than average. Assessment projects across Western Alaska indicate a stronger than expected chum salmon run which is reflected in fishers' subsistence harvest reports. The department has determined that there is an available surplus of sockeye salmon to allow for a commercial fishery.

There is one commercial processor registered to buy in the Kuskokwim Bay Area; Please contact Jon Saarheim with WildFish Marketing at 907-236-6024 with questions regarding selling your catch. It is the commercial fisherman's responsibility to ensure that they have a market for their catch.

Fishermen must have their CFEC permit valid for the 2026 season and a government issued I.D. or Driver's License. All crewmembers must have a 2026 commercial crewmember's license or a 2026 State of Alaska commercial fishing permit.

Commercial fishermen are encouraged to consult Fish and Game regulations prior to beginning commercial fishing operations.

District 4, Quinhagak

Commercial fishing will open in District 4, Quinhagak for a **12-hour period from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Tuesday, July 7, 2026.**

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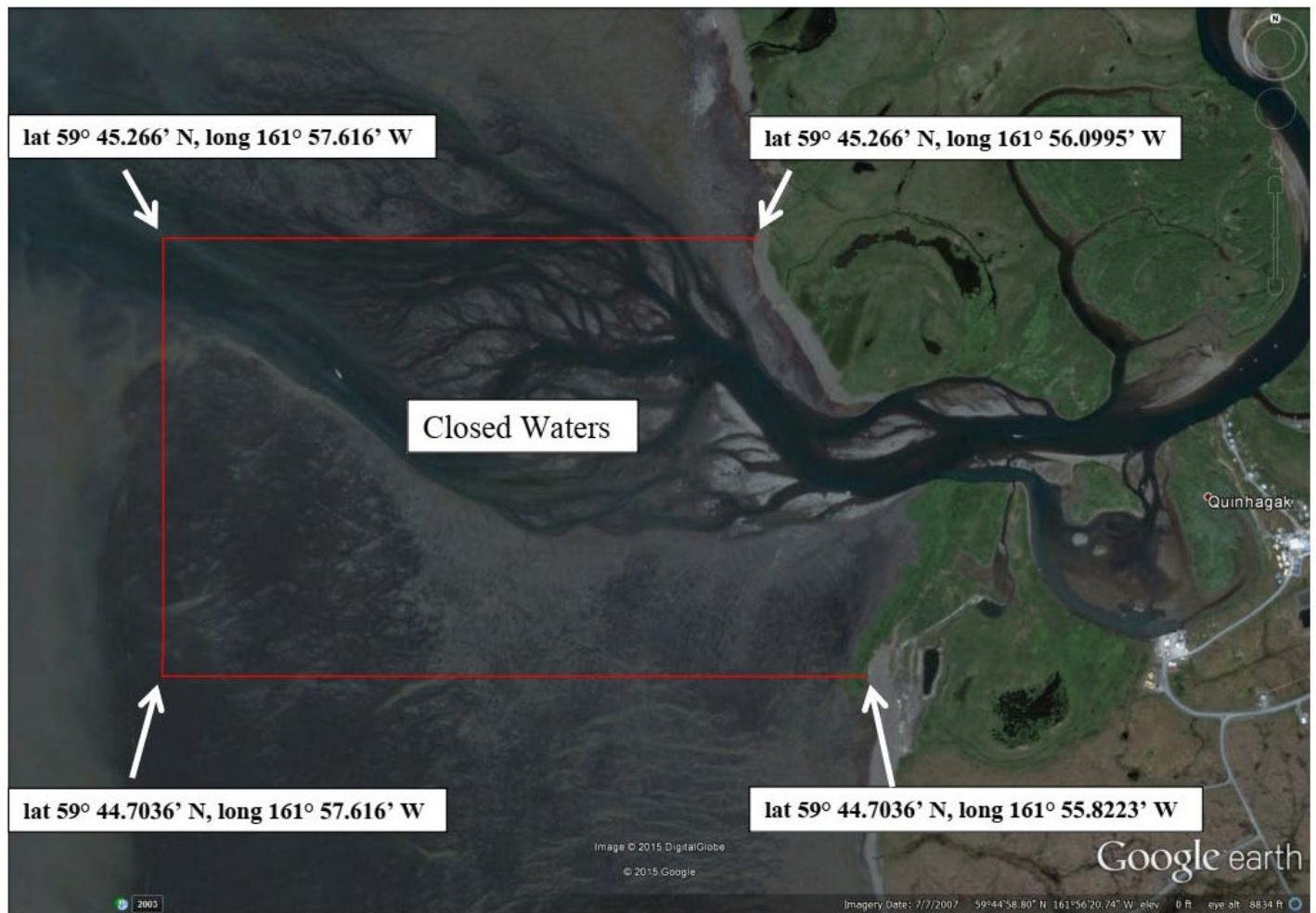


Figure 1. Closed waters for District 4, Quinhagak.

The open area for this period is reduced for conservation of Chinook Salmon. The closed waters will be south of a line at lat 59° 45.266' N., north of a line at lat 59° 44.7036' N., and east of a line at long 161° 57.616' W. This will create a closed waters box around the Kanektok River mouth. The box will be approximately 500 yards to the north and south of the river mouth and extend approximately one mile offshore (Figure 1). The GPS coordinates will be the legal definition of the closed waters. The remainder of District 4 will be open to commercial salmon fishing.

In District 4, subsistence fishing will be **closed** during the following times:

- **12:01 a.m. Tuesday, July 7, 2026 until 12:01 a.m. Wednesday, July 8, 2026**

ADF&G will assess the catches from Tuesday's periods before deciding on the next commercial fishing period.

Fishermen in Districts 4 are reminded that they may retain any portion of their catch for personal or subsistence use. Fish retained for personal or subsistence use from a commercial fishery must be reported and recorded in the space provided on an ADF&G fish ticket. Fishermen are also reminded that gillnet gear may not be operated in a manner that obstructs more than one half the width of any waterway. In the intertidal zone, this restriction applies at all tide stages.

The department will be closely monitoring commercial fishing periods to assess fishery performance and announcement of additional commercial fishing periods as warranted. Further announcements will be made from the Bethel Fish and Game office, on the State of Alaska website (<http://www.adfg.alaska.gov/index.cfm?adfg=cfnews.main>), local radio stations, and Kuskokwim River Facebook Page (<https://www.facebook.com/KuskoRiverFishingADFG/>). Advisory Announcements will be faxed to area villages and local fish processing companies.
