SOUTHEAST ALASKA SALMON PURSE SEINE FISHERY ANNOUNCEMENT

Sitka. . . The Alaska Department of Fish and Game announced today that the following areas will be open to purse seining during the times and in the areas listed below.

District 2

The following area will be open to purse seining from 5:00 a.m., Sunday, June 18, through 8:00 p.m., Wednesday, June 21, 2017:

District 2: will be open north of 54°47.08' N. latitude (located approximately 0.5 nautical miles south of McLean Point Light), south of the northernmost tip of Polk Island located at 55°00.73' N. latitude and west of a line from approximately 2 nautical miles east of the northernmost tip of Polk Island at 55°00.73' N. latitude, 131°55.32' W. longitude to approximately 2.2 nautical miles east and 0.5 nautical miles south of McLean Point Light at 54°47.08' N. latitude, 131°53.96' W. longitude with the following restriction:

Moira Sound: all waters will be closed.

District 12

The following area will be open to purse seining from 5:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m., Sunday, June 18, 2017:

Section 12-A: will be open in the following areas:

Point Augusta: will be open within 0.5 nautical miles from the Chichagof Island shoreline south of 58°03.00' N. latitude and north of a regulatory marker at 58°01.63' N. latitude (located one nautical mile south of Point Augusta Light);

Tenakee Inlet: will be open west of a line from the easternmost tip of East Point to South Passage Point Light to South Passage Point and east of the longitude of Corner Bay Point;

Hidden Falls Terminal Harvest Area (THA): will be open in the waters of Chatham Strait within the boundaries of a line from South Point, as indicated by a marker at $57^{\circ}16.28'$ N. latitude, $134^{\circ}51.78'$ W. longitude to a point offshore at $57^{\circ}16.28'$ N. latitude, $134^{\circ}48.00'$ W. longitude, then running south to a point offshore at $57^{\circ}06.76'$ N. latitude, $134^{\circ}43.00'$ W.

longitude then due west to a point on the Baranof Island shoreline at 57°06.76′ N. latitude, 134°47.50′ W. longitude with the following restriction:

<u>Kasnyku Bay</u>: will be closed north and west of a line from North Point at $57^{\circ}13.36'$ N. latitude, $134^{\circ}50.53'$ W. longitude to the northernmost tip of Round Island to the southernmost tip of Round Island to a point on the Baranof Island shoreline at $57^{\circ}12.48'$ N. latitude, $134^{\circ}50.98'$ W. longitude.

The intent of the spring fishery outside of Kendrick Bay is to harvest SSRAA produced chum salmon returning to the THA. To minimize the harvest of wild stock salmon, fishing area will be limited to within 2 nautical miles of the Prince of Wales Island shoreline and fishing time and area may be reduced in subsequent openings.

Fishermen, tenders, and processors are reminded that harvest from the Kendrick Bay THA must be kept and reported on a **separate** fish ticket from harvest outside of the Kendrick Bay THA. The statistical area for the Kendrick Bay THA is 102-15 and includes the waters of McLean Arm and Kendrick Bay. The statistical areas for portions of District 2 open outside of the Kendrick Bay THA are 102-10 (Kendrick Bay south) and 102-20 (Kendrick Bay north).

<u>King Salmon Landing Restrictions</u>: For Kendrick Bay THA and the District 2 fishery, NO king salmon may be retained, landed, or sold. This includes king salmon less than 28 inches in length.

For all other fishing areas open outside of THAs, king salmon 28 inches or greater in length may NOT be retained and sold. King salmon greater than 21 inches and less than 28 inches may be retained but not sold. King salmon 21 inches or less may be retained and sold. All king salmon harvested in the Hidden Falls, Anita Bay, and Neets Bay THAs may be retained and sold. All king salmon harvested in the Deep Inlet THA must be retained and may be sold.

The 2017 forecasted run of summer chum salmon to Hidden Falls Terminal Harvest Area is 510,000 fish. Of this run, 190,000 fish are needed for broodstock leaving 320,000 fish available for common property harvest. NSRAA is not planning any direct cost-recovery harvest at Hidden Falls. Additionally, due to the low forecasted run of chum salmon, there will be no tax assessment in the HFH THA. Purse seine openings are scheduled to begin June 18 with no Thursday opening the first week. Due to recent run failures and a weak forecast, only 2-3 openings are anticipated prior to the anticipated closure for broodstock collection. If the run comes in substantially above forecast, openings will be authorized as numbers allow. In 2016, the HFH chum salmon run came in at 19% of forecast. In 2017, based upon the poor chum salmon run in 2016, broodstock management will be extremely conservative.

The next seine announcement will be issued on **Tuesday**, June 20, 2017.
