### **EXPLANATION:**

This emergency order closes the State of Alaska resident hunting season for mountain goats in registration hunt area RG478 (South Road System; bow and arrow-only) and the registration hunt area RG488 (South Road System; archery/crossbow/muzzleloader-only) on Kodiak Island, at 11:59 p.m., December 6, 2024. These registration hunt areas are located within Game Management Unit 8. This emergency order does not affect the goat hunting regulations in the remainder of Game Management Unit 8.

#### **REGULATION:**

Therefore, the provisions of **5** AAC **85.040** (a) (4), Hunting Seasons and Bag Limits for goat, are superseded by this emergency order, and the following provisions are effective:

## **JUSTIFICATION:**

This emergency order closes the State of Alaska resident hunting season for mountain goats in Kodiak Island registration permit hunt RG478 (South Road System; bow and arrow-only) and hunt

RG488 (South Road System; archery/crossbow/muzzleloader-only). The Department estimated a herd size of 275 goats in the South Road System area; as of December 4, 2024, 41 goats were reported harvested out of a target harvest level of 41 goats.

Registration goat hunts may be utilized to meet predetermined harvest quotas for each hunt area. For this year, the harvest quota for this area has been reached. Harvest that exceeds objectives could lead to reduced hunter opportunities in the future.
