EXPLANATION:

This Emergency Order opens hunting for muskoxen from August 29, 2025, to October 31, 2025, in portions of Units 24B and 26A in the vicinity of Anaktuvuk Pass. The hunt is open to residents only by registration permit and the bag limit is one (1) bull muskox per hunter with a total quota of up to 2 bulls. All other muskox seasons and bag limits in the remainder of Units 24B and 26A are not affected by this Emergency Order.

REGULATION:

The provisions of 5 AAC 92.046, PERMITS FOR TAKING INCIDENTAL OR STRANDED MUSKOXEN, are being implemented in portions of Units 24B and 26A. Therefore, the following regulations in 5AAC 85.050(3), HUNTING SEASONS AND BAG LIMITS FOR MUSKOXEN, are superseded as follows:

In Game Management Unit 24(B), state managed lands within 20 miles of Anaktuvuk Pass, and that portion of Unit 26(A) within 20 miles of Anaktuvuk Pass.

JUSTIFICATION:

In 5AAC 92.046, the Board of Game authorized the Commissioner to open a season for muskoxen in portions of Unit 24 and 26A. The Board adopted this regulation based on testimony from local subsistence hunters that muskoxen have been observed to interfere with caribou movements, adversely affecting subsistence hunting for caribou. The Board of Game left it to the Commissioner to determine, on a case-by-case basis, whether hunting of muskoxen should be used to prevent potential competition with caribou or interference with caribou hunting.

The Commissioner has determined that a bull muskox has recently moved into the Anaktuvuk Pass Area. A portion of the Western Arctic Caribou Herd and Teshekpuk Caribou Herd migrate through this pass during its annual migration. Residents in the village of Anaktuvuk Pass rely on caribou harvested from this area and have testified that local hunters believe muskoxen would likely divert caribou from their normal migration path. Accordingly, the Commissioner has determined that muskox hunting by permit should be allowed on state managed lands within 20 miles of Anaktuvuk Pass with a bag limit of one bull muskoxen per Alaskan resident hunter. The season will be closed when up to two bull muskoxen are taken.

Limited hunt for muskoxen in GMU 26A & 24B near Anaktuvuk opened by emergency order by the Alaska Department of Fish and Game

The Alaska Department of Fish and Game announces an emergency opening of a Muskox hunting season in the portion of Game Management Units 24B and 26A near Anaktuvuk Pass. This Emergency Order is authorized under a special provision authorized by the Alaska Board of Game. The season will be open to resident hunters by permit only from August 29, 2025 until October 31, 2025. The bag limit is 1 bull muskox per hunter. All hunters must have a valid state hunting license and a registration permit. Permits will be issued in Anaktuvuk Pass beginning August 29th. The season will be closed on October 31, 2025, or when up to 2 bull muskoxen in this area have been harvested.
