

# Hunting and Trapping Emergency Order

**EXPLANATION:**

This Emergency Order closes all sheep seasons in the Glacier Mountain Controlled Use Area (GMCUA) in Game Management Unit 20E.

No other sheep hunting regulations in Unit 20E are affected by this emergency order.

**REGULATION:**

Therefore, the following regulations in **5AAC 85.055(a)(8), HUNTING SEASONS AND BAG LIMITS FOR DALL SHEEP**, are superseded by this emergency order, and the following provisions are effective for hunting sheep:

**JUSTIFICATION:**

The GMCUA was created in 1971 to afford greater protection for sheep that used the Glacier Mountain area. Sheep within the GMCUA are part of the larger Tanana Hills sheep population, which exists in marginal non-contiguous sheep habitat over an expansive area of eastern interior Alaska.

The GMCUA contains a small segment of the Upper Tanana Dall sheep population. During the two most recent surveys of the GMCUA, few sheep and no legal rams have been observed in the area. Although the full curl harvest strategy is an extremely conservative approach to hunt management, there are times when more conservative strategies are warranted to address public concerns.
