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ALASKA BOARD OF GAME November 17, 2022 – Web Conference

Preliminary Meeting Summary

The Board of Game (board) met by web-conference on Thursday, November 17, 2022. Seven board members were present: Chairman Jerry Burnett, vice-chair Stosh Hoffman, Al Barrette, Jake Fletcher, Lynn Keogh, James Cooney and Ruth Cusack. The purpose of the meeting was to address thirteen Agenda Changes Requests received by the November 1, 2022, deadline for consideration at the board meetings scheduled for January and March 2023.

Other Board Actions:

• The board approved a board generated proposal to close resident and nonresident Dall sheep hunting in Unit 19C for five years. The proposal will be scheduled for the Southcentral Region meeting in March 2023.

- The board discussed the proposals submitted late on 4/30/22 (Proposals 200-203). The proposal deadline is normally May 1 each year, but because that date fell on a weekend in 2022, the deadline was moved up to Friday, 4/29. The board agreed with scheduling the submittals on 4/30 that the board has authority act on, for the regulatory meetings in 2023.
- The board agreed to extend the Southcentral Region meeting by one day as recommended by the board chair and executive director due to the large number of proposals to be considered.
- The board discussed remote oral testimony and the public comment submission process for the upcoming regulatory meetings. The board agreed to allow limited remote testimony. The board's executive director will work with the chair on the details. The board also agreed to accept public comments submissions (record copies) via the online portal during the regulatory meetings, and to eliminate the requirement for the public to submit 20 copies.
