National Archery in the Schools Program - Alaska

NASP® PROGRAM General info:

- Created by Roy Grimes and first started in March of 2002 in the state of Kentucky.
- This is an "**IN SCHOOL**" program allowing <u>ALL</u> kids an opportunity to participate, whether they can attend after school activities or not. Many students are first time archers!
- All standard equipment (bows will fit EVERYONE)
- <u>Over 14,00 schools and 20 million kids</u> have participated in NASP® Worldwide. (US, 9 Canadian Provinces, United Kingdom, New Zealand, and more!)
- For both Boys and Girls 4th- 12th grades
- Usually part of the PE curriculum
- State, National and World Tournaments are held each year.

WHY is NASP® so popular?

- Archery is fun! 94% of students love it.
- NASP® archery is safe! 20 million students have participated without having any accidents!
- Students enjoy self-improvement and progress!
- Students enjoy competing with friends and being part of a team.

NASP® IN AK:

- Started in Alaska in 2006. Alaska Department of Fish and Game (ADF&G) Hunter Information and Training Program runs NASP®.

- 2023 reports showed 8,748 kids in AK participating.
- Alaska has a yearly NASP® "virtual" tournament. The 2023-2024 state bullseye tournament had 18 schools and 318 archers that participated.
- Over 350 Basic Archery Instructors are certified in Alaska!

Getting NASP® Started at your school!

In order to offer NASP® in your school, you need three very important things!

- 1. In School Agreement with NASP®- you must agree to offer the program during school hours
- 2. A NASP® approved archery kit.
- 3. Certified NASP® instructors

Training and Archery Kit Cost:

Training: Training is a one-day course. ADF&G provides the instructor and the \$50.00 NASP® training packet. Trainings can accommodate up 12 instructors depending on space at facility.

Kit Cost: The cost of the standard NASP® approved Archery kit is roughly \$4K plus shipping. Shipping is about \$850 per kit (request more information about shipping options). A standard kit consists of:

- 12 bows (11 to 20 MAX draw Wt.) (Draw length: variable. Genesis bow fits all)
- 5 dozen arrows (aluminum for safety)
- Safety curtain
- Bow rack
- Repair kit
- 5 targets
- Floor quivers

Grants are available to help in purchasing a kit. For the 2024-2025 school year, grants are \$1,500 off one full kit for schools new to the NASP® program. Contact your coordinator for more information: dfg.dwc.hit.nasp@alaska.gov

FAQ:

Q. Can I teach NASP® in my school as an afterschool program only?

A. Yes and No. You may have an afterschool program that uses NASP® equipment and is run by a certified coach, but you cannot receive grants to offset costs of equipment, participate in the state tournament, or the Academic Archer program.

Q. Can I order NASP® equipment from another vendor?

A. Yes, however you can only order approved NASP® gear, and NASP® has a better discounted price for NASP® schools than other vendors.

Q. Do you need archery experience to become a certified NASP® Basic Archery Instructor?

A. No! You do not need archery experience, everything you need to know to lead NASP® with students will be taught to you during the 8-hour training course.
