

DEMERSAL SHELF ROCKFISH (DSR)



YELLOWEYE

- Bright golden yellow eye
- Rounded anal fin and may have dark edges on fins
- Size: up to 36 inches



QUILLBACK

- Brown body mottled with yellow/orange and freckles on head/throat
- Yellow markings on prominent dorsal spines
- Size: up to 24 inches



CANARY

- Three orange stripes on head and light lateral line
- Anal fin slanted back
- Size: up to 30 inches



CHINA

- Broad yellow stripe along lateral line starting on dorsal fin
- Radial eye bars
- Size: up to 17 inches



COPPER

- Light colored stripe along rear 2/3 of lateral line
- Size: up to 22 inches



TIGER

- Thin red-brown bands
- Two eye bars
- Size: up to 24 inches



ROSETHORN

- Light spots on upper back
- Size: up to 16 inches

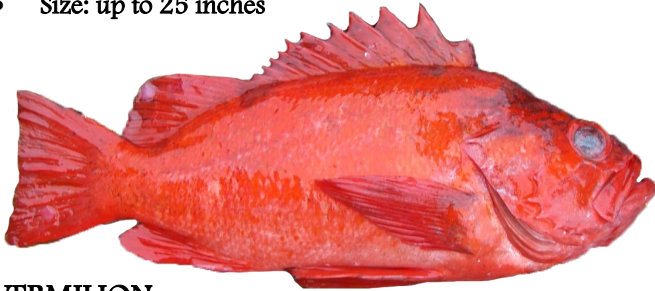
All anglers sport fishing in salt waters of Southeast Alaska must have on board and readily available for use a functional deepwater release device to return ALL ROCKFISH that are not harvested to the depth of capture, or to at least 100 feet, whichever is shallower.

COMMON SLOPE ROCKFISH



REDBANDED

- Thick red bands
- One eye bar
- Size: up to 25 inches



VERMILION

- Often uniform in color
- Thick base at tail and rough, scaly lower jaw
- Size: up to 30 inches



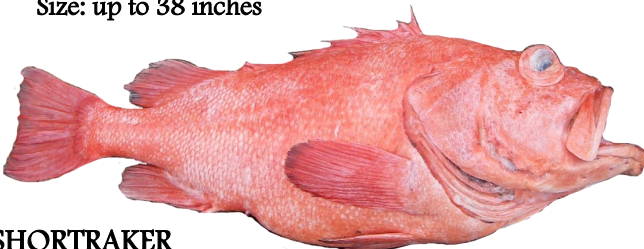
SILVERGRAY

- Light belly and large projecting lower jaw with large knob
- Size: up to 28 inches



ROUGHEYE

- Dark splotch on gill plate
- Rough spines under eye
- Usually caught at depths greater than 400 feet
- Size: up to 38 inches



SHORTRAKER

- Gill rakers short. No splotch on gill plate
- Usually caught at depths greater than 400 feet
- Size: up to 43 inches

PELAGIC ROCKFISH



BLACK

- Blue-black with white belly
- Size: up to 25 inches



DARK

- Uniformly blue-black
- Size: up to 20 inches



DUSKY

- Greenish brown w/ light belly and fins tinged pink or orange
- Size: up to 20 inches



WIDOW

- Small mouth
- Slim body
- Size: up to 23 inches



YELLOWTAIL

- Fins washed yellow
- Size: up to 26 inches
