

NOTICE: RC503 Mulchatna caribou hunting remains closed

Ingutem iluani 2022-ami, biologist-aat naaqillruut Mulchatna tuntunek. Arenqiggegnani, cali amllertaciat mikuitqapiggtuq **12,100 pitaaluteng, nuriigaluku cuqliuraq** 30,000-80,000 tuntunek.

In July of 2022, biologists conducted an extensive survey of the Mulchatna herd. Unfortunately, numbers remain low at an estimated **12,100 animals, well below the objective** of 30,000-80,000 caribou.

Biologist-aat egmirrqurtut yurviriillermeggnek cali pillggutetlluki nunalget taringauruluku ciin ikegilllrat.

Biologists continue to research and work with local communities to understand reasons for the decline.

Pisuullerkaq cali umgusngauq, nalaacilleq tuntumek kinguvaciiqaat mikuurillerkaat.

Hunting remains closed. Killing caribou will slow the herd's recovery.

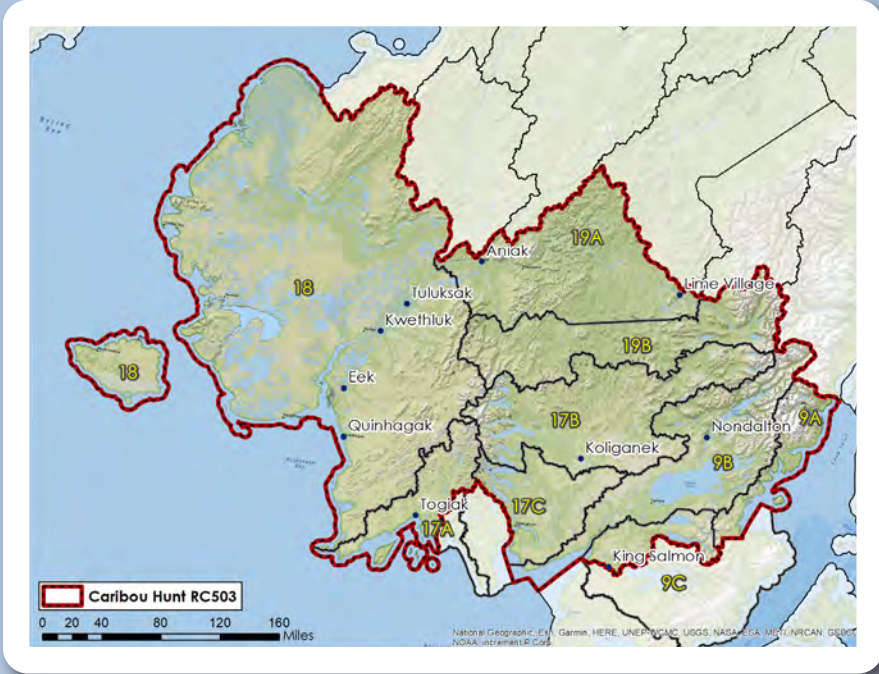
