The Department of Law has reviewed the attached regulations of the Department of Fish and Game against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. This letter constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations. The regulations were adopted by the Department of Fish and Game after the close of the public comment period.

The regulations amend 5 AAC 40 to update requirements related to the permitting and management of private nonprofit shellfish and salmon hatcheries.

The November 27, 2024 public notice, the January 12, 2025 supplemental notice and the March 26, 2025 adoption order all state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.060 is not required.
