

Subsistence Way of Life



I grew up living off our land and bay. It is a way of life that my children have not been able to fully learn.

We haven't been able to hunt ou caribou for the last nine years.

We can't get enough fish from our bay to meet our economic needs as well as our subsistence needs

- Meshik River has not been managed properly by Fish and Game
- There are no escapement goals for kings, chum, silvers and pinks
- Area M fishermen can operate in our bay as well the locals

Since the line has moved for Area M we have seen a impact to our financial sustainability and to our subsistence way of life.


With our subsistence nets in the water all season we still cannot fill all our needs in my community
