PROPOSALS BEFORE THE COMMITTEE WERE: (10 total) 226, 227, 228, 229, 230, 231, 232, 233, 234, 235.

PROPOSAL 226 – 5 AAC 47.020. General provisions for seasons and bag, possession, annual, and size limits for the salt waters of the Southeast Alaska Area; 5 AAC 55.022. General provisions for seasons, bag, possession, and size limits, and methods and means for the Prince William Sound Area; 5 AAC 58.022. Waters; seasons; bag, possession, and size limits; and special provisions for Cook Inlet-Resurrection Bay Saltwater Area; 5 AAC 64.022. Waters; seasons; bag, possession, and size limits; and special provisions for the Kodiak Area; 5 AAC 65.020. Bag limits, possession limits, and size limits for Alaska Peninsula and Aleutian Islands Area; and 5 AAC 75.012. Sport Shark Fishery Management Plan. Update regulations to accurately reflect changes to the statewide Sport Shark Fishery Management Plan which allowed for an increased bag and possession limit of spiny dogfish shark and no annual limit requirement.

Public Panel Comments:

• There is an overabundance of spiny dogfish and we should harvest as many as we can.

PROPOSAL 227 – 5 AAC 75.003. Emergency order authority. Provide the department with emergency order (EO) authority to restrict sport proxy fishing.

Comment Summary:

Department:

- For 2012, of 3,883 proxy permits issued; 28 were issued for blind beneficiaries, 459 were 70% disabled, and 3,417 were 65 or older.
- If used, restriction would apply to a specific species for a specific water body.

Department of Law: None.

Federal Subsistence Representative: None.

Public Panel Comments:

- Amend proposal to apply only to proxies issued for beneficiaries who are disabled.
- Beneficiaries who receive these fish really value these fish.
- Restricting proxy fishing would provide minimal reduction in harvest.
- Just close the fishery if it gets down to a level that would require restricting proxy fishing.
- Another tool for the department's tool box.
- Would not prevent a proxy fisher from fishing another area that is still open.
- Would add additional complexity to regulations for minimal effect.
- Beneficiaries have the same right to these fish as other anglers.
- Proxy regulations were amended at a previous statewide board meeting to tighten up reporting and recording requirements.

Public Panel Recommendation: No consensus.

PROPOSAL 228 – 5 AAC 75.995. Definitions. Prohibit the practice of "high grading" by anglers.

Comment Summary:

Department:

- This would closely align state bag limit definition with the federal halibut bag limit definition.
- Trooper discretion is used in defining "immediately" when releasing fish.

Department of Law: None.

Federal Subsistence Representative: None.

Public Panel Comments:

- Provides additional clarity for sport fishing guides to explain to clients why they cannot high-grade fish.
- High-grading has been seen to occur in some fishing derbies.
- High-grading is unethical.
- Concern over strict enforcement of the definition of "immediate" by other agencies.
- In a catch-and-release fishery, would this be a problem if someone held the fish for a picture.
- Need to be very clear on the definition of "immediate". Maybe add language such as "before resuming fishing" or "before leaving the fishing area".

PROPOSAL 229 – 5 AAC 75.006. Harvest record for finfish with an annual limit. Specify harvest record reporting requirements for additional sport fishing licenses and harvest records.

Comment Summary:

Department:

- Under sport fishing guide regulations, the guide is responsible for a client violation. A violation regarding an additional license issued to a client is highly unlikely to apply to the guide unless the guide was the vendor who issued the first license.
- Gives enforcement officers a slightly better tool to enforce annual limit recording requirements.

Department of Law: None.

Federal Subsistence Representative: None.

Public Panel Comments:

- Enforcement of the recording of annual limits is already difficult and this would not make it any better.
- Concern was expressed that a guide would be subject to a violation that his client committed without his knowledge.

PROPOSAL 230 - 5 AAC 75.005. Possession of licenses, stamps and harvest record. If duplicate licenses are issued, ensure that the section for season or annual limits is removed from duplicate.

Public Panel Comments:

- Punishes the honest angler.
- Needlessly reduces fishing opportunity to anglers who accidently lose their fishing license.

PROPOSAL 231 – 5 AAC 75.995. Definitions. Define the term "compensation".

• State prosecutor has some difficulty with cases because compensation is not defined.

• Will prevent abuse from luxury yachts fishing Sitka waters.

PROPOSAL 232 – 5 AAC 75.026. Use of sport-caught fish as bait. Clarify the use of sport-caught fish as bait.

Public Panel Comments:

- Would like to amend the proposal to include pink salmon but understand this would be an area-specific proposal, not a statewide proposal.
- Would like to see species that are prohibited for bait under commercial regulations also be listed under sport regulations.

PROPOSAL 233 – 5 AAC 75.022(d). Freshwater sport fishing. Create an exemption for the use of footgear with felt soles for the disabled or handicapped fisherman.

Comment Summary:

Department of Law: None.

Federal Subsistence Representative: None.

Public Panel Comments:

- People don't know there is an avenue available to receive a disability exemption.
- Prohibition of felt soles is an important conservation measure to prevent spread of invasive species.
- There are good alternatives available as replacement for felt soles.

PROPOSAL 234 – 5 AAC 75.020. Sport fishing gear. Ban use of lead weights in fresh and salt waters of Alaska in sport fisheries.

Public Panel Comments:

• No studies on lead fishing weights supporting negative effects on wildlife.

PROPOSAL 235 – 5 AAC 75.0XX. New Regulation; 5 AAC 75.005. Possession of licenses, stamps and harvest record. Establish mandatory reporting system for sport fisheries statewide.

Comment Summary:

Department:

• Department is working on electronic reporting and licensing.

Department of Law: None.

Federal Subsistence Representative: None.

Public Panel Comments:

- Burden to anglers to record their harvest out in the field.
- Burden on the department to collect and record this data.
- Difficult to remember sport harvest at the end of the year through Statewide Harvest Survey.
- Concerned about small systems that might not be accurately assessed.
- Double reporting of harvest may occur between guided logbooks and individual angler reporting.
- Guide logbooks already capture harvest of guided fishing.

Public Panel Recommendation: No consensus.
