We the undersigned fully support adoption of proposal # 51 to be considered by the Alaska Board of Fisheries during the Bristol Bay meeting from December 2-8, 2015. We firmly believe that by voting in favor of amending the language of 5AAC 06.333 to allow one individual to hold two Bristol Bay Drift permits in his or her name and fish them concurrently with 200 fathoms of gear will create benefits to ALL Bristol Bay salmon drift gillnet fishers for the following reasons:

- There is no other mechanism available to help get the numbers of boats fishing closer to the optimum number established in CFEC report of 2005.
- For every additional boat fishing in a dual configuration 100 fathoms of gear is removed from the water. This is the key benefit that would be achieved with adoption of the proposed change. If for instance over time 300 additional boats were to fish in a dual configuration, 30,000 fathoms less gear would be fished in Bristol Bay. 34 miles of gillnet would effectively be removed from the water. This creates the following benefits to ALL Bristol Bay fishers
 - A) The removal of thousands of fathoms of gillnet gear from the water combined with fewer boats fishing benefits those that choose to continue to fish a single, 150 fathom unit of gear and those fishing 200 in dual configuration. Less gear straining the water, fewer boats fishing means that every boat, regardless of single or dual permit has access to more fish in a much less crowded environment.
 - B) The fishery becomes far more economically sustainable for all participants in all quartiles.
 - C) Raising the average per vessel income will provide the necessary resources to continue to upgrade RSW, Icing and Harvesting technology we so desperately need to enhance the overall quality of the Bristol Bay harvest to create more value in domestic and global markets.
