Miscellaneous Business Agenda

1. Sport fishing license age requirements and youth (under 16) fisheries

The board was alerted to its revised authority gained through the passage of House Bill 137 during the 2016 Legislative session. Previously, the board had authority to establish youth fisheries for persons under 16 years of age. HB137, a bill that increased licensing fees for sport fishing and hunting, amended the board's authority to establish fisheries for residents under 18 and non-residents under 16. The board could review current youth fisheries in light of new authority, but it was not essential. The board chose to take no action on this new authority at this time.

2. Discussion on Kodiak genetics sockeye and King salmon studies

The board received two letters seeking major action by the board on Kodiak salmon management plans due to recent genetics studies on Kodiak salmon fisheries (RC 54 and RC 55). The department reported it would be a significant undertaking to open up Kodiak salmon management plans at the Upper Cook Inlet (UCI) meeting. Members of the board concurred there was not adequate time for the public to review the results and the department reports and asked the department if it was possible to have additional reporting on Cook Inlet origin salmon caught in the Kodiak salmon fisheries at the UCI meeting, including the Kenai and Kasilof rivers, sockeye stocks of concern, and other stocks with high utilization and biological concern.

3. Long-term look at Bering Sea crab harvest strategy

The board and department discussed a path to begin reviewing crab harvest strategies for Bering Sea fisheries. The department will have a proposed regulatory process for the board to consider in order to have revisions in place before next year's crab fishery.

4. Draft letter to Legislature on habitat permitting

The board reviewed its draft letter to the Legislature that was developed at the Lower Cook Inlet Finfish meeting and revised based on board input. The board approved the revised copy to be sent to the Legislature.
