



- ✓In effect from June 1–October 31
- Fishing periods established by emergency order (EO)
- Purse seine and hand purse seine gear
- Organized into districts or groups of districts
  - **←** Eastern District
  - Chignik Bay and Central districts
  - → Western and Perryville districts

Early-run BEG: 350,000–450,000


Late-run SEG: 200,000–400,000

#### **Inriver Run Goal (IRRG)**


- → 75,000 sockeye salmon in addition to late run escapement objectives to provide for late season subsistence needs
- → 25,000 of the IRRG sockeye salmon in August

Late-run SEG + IRRG = 275,000-400,000







#### Chignik River Early-Run Sockeye Salmon Escapement




#### Chignik River Late-Run Sockeye Salmon Escapement




# Chignik River Sockeye Salmon Escapement in August and Early September (Inriver Run Goal)




#### **Chignik River Coho Salmon Escapement**














#### **CMA Peak Chum Salmon Escapement**

















#### **CMA Pink Salmon Harvest**

# 2019 Chignik Salmon BOF Proposals

- Proposal 147: Reduce the Chignik River sockeye salmon Inriver Run Goal
- Proposal 148: Manage the Western and Perryville districts based on salmon stocks in portions of Area M from July 9–September 30
- Proposal 149: Allow more fishing opportunity in the Western District in June and early July
- Proposals 150 and 151: Allow more fishing opportunity in the Western and Perryville districts in June and early July
- Proposal 152: Prohibit commercial fishing in the Perryville District and Mitrofania Section of the CMA when Orzinski weir in Area M is not meeting escapement goals

## 2019 Chignik Salmon BOF Proposals

- Proposal 153: Prohibit commercial fishing in the Perryville District and the Mitrofania Section of the CMA when SEDM is closed over escapement concerns
- Proposal 154: Count only large king salmon towards the Chignik River King salmon escapement goal
- → Proposal 158: Increase the maximum seine length in the Central, Eastern, Western and Perryville districts
