We have no more to give on the Yukon to save
our salmon returns we are reduced to 4in Loft long
nets to satisfy our fish needs., not salmon

Every since the Adoption of the MAGNASON/STEVEN ACT.
In 1974 and the establishment of the
Area M Fisheries ^{by the state of AK} to target 8% of the BB sockeye
stock. The Fisheries in the AYK Region
have been going down hill too we are at
Rock Bottom

We kept foreign Fleets At Bay DSC - MSA

now they have devasted us the 60-70 thousand
2/3rds of the Adfis management Districts

have no more salmon stories and traditions to live and pass on to our families. It is like History - a story of the past. Empty camps, fish racks ... All stories you have heard the reports of how salmon has been declining by the ATYK managers studies needing to be done but no money for research.

The trawl and Intercoastal Fisheries have ~~not~~ contributed financially to the cause but take take take...

more WAF studies need to be done on the Yukon scale sampling and species. Research is done annually and immediately sampling in areas in fisheries now or little is collected for research by ~~not~~ ATYK. For species origins 19% is a lot for the Yukon chum salmon as they are below forecast, and escapement goals ^{not} met when they return to the Yukon..

Reduced harvest beyond the river systems need to be implemented and time reduced in all Intercoastal fisheries where they

Are Known

And to work with the North Pacific Fisheries Management Council to reduce bycatch for chinook and chum salmon for returns to the AYK region again 2/3 rds of the department's management area need your help to restore our salmon returns before we deem them endangered and nobody will fish like on the Yukon today

Lastly find every means to meet our treaty obligations with Canada
Ironically if you do you will be helping us
