

- Federal: Federal waters (3-200 nmi) guided by NPFMC process. Harvest deducted from federal TAC.
- **Parallel:** State waters (0-3 nmi) concurrent with adjacent federal fishery and generally adopt federal regulations and management measures as guided by the board process. Harvest deducted from federal TAC.
- State-waters (GHL): State waters (0-3 nmi) guided by the board process. Harvest deducted from state GHL.

BSAI Area Federal Pacific Cod Fisheries

- Federal waters 3 200 nmi
- 2022 harvest limit (TAC) based on 89% of federal Pacific cod BS ABC and 67% of AI ABC Gear sectors: trawl, longline, pot and jig gear (CV and CP)
- Most sectors operate under multiple seasons
- No gear limits
- Limited access/rationalized
- Steller sea lion (SSL) protection measures
- Observer requirements




BSAI Area State-Waters Pacific Cod Fisheries

- State waters 0 3 nmi
- Harvest limits (GHL) based on a percentage of federal Pacific cod ABCs
- Most seasons open after federal/parallel fisheries close

- Gear varies by fishery
- Open access exclusive registration
- Follow some SSL protection measures
- No observer requirements




Pacific Cod Stock Assessment Process



Aleutian Islands Subdistrict (AIS)

- Promote opportunity for <60 ft vessels that deliver to local shorebased processors
- Acknowledge historical fishery participants and reduce likelihood of stranding AI GHL/ABC



- Fishery began 2006
- GHL = up to 39% federal AI ABC
 - Increases 4% each year if previous GHL achieved (max 39%)
 - If GHL is not achieved two consecutive years GHL decreases
 4% to a min of 15%
 - 15 million lb maximum GHL limit
 - Not allocated between gear types
- Exclusive registration area
- Legal gear
 - Pot, trawl, jig, longline
- 150,000 lb daily and trip limit

Clarify openings, management time zones, landing requirements, and reporting requirements.

- Open all waters of the AIS on March 15th for all gear types/vessel sizes if Federal >60 pot gear A season does not close by March 15th
- Use Alaska Time for fishery openings/closures
- All Pacific cod onboard at start of delivery must be delivered before a vessel can put more fish onboard for their next trip
- Vessels must report amount of gear operated and pounds of Pacific cod as directed by the department
- May not retrieve gear after the fishery closure until all Pacific cod onboard has been delivered

Repeal current management plan and transition AIS to pot/jig fishery


- Jan 1 opening Adak Section
 - ≤60 ft trawl, pot, jig
 - ≤58 ft longline
- 4 days after federal >60 pot closure opening – all waters
 - ≤100 ft pot
 - ≤60 ft trawl, jig
 - ≤58 ft longline
- March 15 at noon opening all waters
 - ≤125 ft pot
 - ≤ 100 ft trawl
- 150,000 lb daily and delivery limit, no pot gear limits
- GHL not allocated by gear type or vessel size

Proposed

- All state-waters open January 1
- Only pot vessels ≤100 ft and jig gear ≤58 ft eligible for fishery
- 120 pot limit
- Limit pot vessels ≥59 from harvesting more than 25% of GHL

Move >60 ft trawl vessel start date from March 15 to March 1



 - 2022 GHL = 11%
- Opens access / exclusive registration area
- Opens after federal <60 HAL/Pot A-season
- Pot vessels ≤58 ft OAL
- 60 pot limit

Jig Gear:

- Fishery established in 2019
- GHL = 100,000 lbs
- Nonexclusive registration
- Opens May 1
- Vessels ≤58 ft OAL
- 5 jig machine limit





Clarify gear marking and landing requirements for groundfish in the Bering Sea-Aleutian Islands

- Require vessels to land all catch within 72 hours of a fishery closure
- Require vessels to mark buoys with ADF&G vessel number
- Clarify when pots can be longlined

- Fishery began in 1997
- Vessels ≤58 ft OAL
- Pot and jig gear only
- GHL = 30% federal WGOA ABC
 - Jig gear 15% of GHL
 - Pot gear 85% of GHL
- Open access/exclusive registration area
- Opens after federal/parallel fisheries close
- Gear limited to 60 pots or 5 jig machines




Clarify weather delay provision for the South Alaska Peninsula Pacific cod fishery






- Fishery began 1995
- GHL = ~5% of combined federal BSAI ABC
 - Not allocated between gear types
 - GHL achieved from 1996 to 2002 and then not achieved again until 2022 season
- Legal gear
 - Pots, jig, longline, hand troll
- Open concurrently with federal IFQ season
- All vessels fishing within 3nmi, including those with IFQ/CDQ, must register for the state-waters fishery

Set GHL at 5% of the combined federal Bering Sea and Aleutian Islands sablefish ABCs



Establish guiding principles for groundfish fishery regulations

- No policy statement or defined objectives for state-managed groundfish fisheries
- Provide transparency and guidance when deliberating changes to groundfish fishery regulations
- Aid sustainability certification for state-managed groundfish fisheries
