

Prince William Sound Management Area





Proposals

- Changing sablefish season dates.
 - Proposals 18, 19, 20, and 24
- Allow multiple gear types in Sablefish fishery
 - Proposals 21 and 22
- Operating gear in Federal and State waters on the same trip
 - Proposal 23
- Noncommercial fisheries
 - Proposals 1, 25, and 26.




- Limited entry fishery (61 permits)
- Four permit classes (5 AAC 28.272)
- GHL tied to GOA sablefish ABC
- Effort primarily longline hook and longline pot
 - Pots must be longlined (5 AAC 28.230(i))
 - No pot limit
- Sablefish season is April 15 August 31 (5 AAC 28.210(b))
 - Season extended 2020 2022
- Rockfish bycatch allowance is 20% (5 AAC 28.265(b)(2))
- May not operate groundfish gear in state waters if retaining sablefish in federal waters (5 AAC 28.272(g))
- Multiple gear types not allowed (5 AAC 28.230(j))




PWS Pollock Pelagic Trawl Fishery Harvest and Fishery Information

- Trawl gear and king salmon bycatch
 - Proposal 14
- Change 5% bycatch limit to static limit in pounds
 - Proposal 15
- Close PWS pollock pelagic trawl fishery
 - Proposal 16
- Observer requirements
 - Proposal 17






- State waters GHL is 2.5% of the W/C/WYK GOA ABC
- Open access fishery
- PWS Walleye Pollock Pelagic Trawl Fishery Management Plan.
 - Season is January 20 March 31 (5 AAC 28.210(e))
 - 300,000 trip limits (5 AAC 28.073)
 - No more than 60% by weight of pollock may be taken from any one section (5 AAC 28.263(c))
 - Bycatch may not exceed 5% of the pollock GHL (5 AAC 28.263(d))



 - Proposals 9, 11, and 12
- Allowable Biological Catch allocation.
 - Proposal 8
- Increase pot limits in state waters Pacific cod fishery
 - Proposal 10



Management

Parallel groundfish fishery: "Fishery in state waters opened by EO to correspond with a federal fishery in adjacent waters"


- Parallel seasons in PWS are tied to 3 Federal seasons
 - CGOA Pacific cod jig fishery
 - CGOA Pacific cod pot fishery
 - CGOA Pacific cod longline hook (HAL)
- State waters seasons are opened after parallel seasons close


Similarities


- Registration
- Bycatch allowances
- Rockfish bycatch goes to state waters rockfish GHL

Differences

- No pot limit in parallel fishery
- No longlining of pots in parallel fishery
- Different times of year, do not overlap by gear type








PWS Lingcod Fishery Proposals

- Prohibit directed fishing for lingcod with longline hook gear
 - Proposal 7
- Allow the release of rockfish in commercial jig fisheries
 - Proposal 6




PWS Lingcod Fishery Management


- Static GHL based on historic harvest
 - 7,300 pounds PWS Inside
 - 25,300 pounds PWS Outside
- Directed fishery
 - Longline hook and mechanical jig gear
- Bycatch fishery
 - Longline hook, 20% lingcod retention
- Season is July 1 December 31, unless closed by EO (5 AAC 28.210(c))
- Size limit of 35 inches (5 AAC 28.270(a))



PWS Groundfish Summary

- PWS groundfish fisheries are diverse
- Participants often participate in many or all fisheries
- Many of the proposals have potential to affect rockfish bycatch in PWS
- Halibut fishery harvests most rockfish
- Additional management tools needed
