
Purpose

- Considered in 2009
- Department recommendation
 - Cost savings
 - Improvements in information and research
 - Redistribute staff and advisory committee effort
- Discussed at 2013 work session
 - Feedback from advisory committee members



Survey

- Ran January February 2014
- All advisory committee members were polled
- Received 154 qualified responses

Western (5 / 8%)

Interior (29 / 19%)

Southeast (21 / 15%)

Southwest (15 / 11%)

Southcentral (73 / 39%)


Limitations

AC Efforts

Region (BOG / BOF / Other)

Arctic (57% / 25% / 17%)

Western (33% / 38% / 29%) 1nterior (64% / 27% / 9%)



Southwest (30% / 59% / 11%) Southeast (30% / 62% / 8%)
Southcentral (46% / 49% / 5%)

AC Workload

- Effort in 2-Year Cycles
 - Manageable in general



- More difficult during "double whammy" years
- Workload under a 3-Year Cycle
 - Majority say the workload would be less
 - Estimates of hours worked indicate less annual effort

Impacts on Management and Cost

- Management
 - Slight majority thought there isn't adequate time to see the impacts on game resources
- Cost
 - Somewhat significant factor

Costs for a board meeting averages \$10K a day.
