- VII. Old Business:

Mark Adams from U.S. Army Alaska G-3 gave a recap of last hunting season on military land in Alaska. Closure maps were out in July. About 1528 hunters according to USARTRAK. About the same number of citations issued this year as in previous years. Don Quarberg commended USARAK on keeping DTA West mostly open in Moose Season.

VIII. New Business:

Calendar – Delta AC will conduct both officer and member elections in April. Next meetings will be 15 NOV and 13 DEC.

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Vern gave an update on the 40-mile Caribou Herd: Population is up and seems healthy/growing. Canada is likely to start using their hunting quota which they have not been doing in past several years. The events on the Steese highway this year, the overkilling of the quota/harvest goal, and unethical /unsafe behavior by hunters sparked a lively discussion. All present support some measures to restore sanity, safety, and a sense of a quality hunt to this and other road accessible hunts. One suggestion isto make Hunter Safety course mandatory for anyone who has not hunted in Alaska before, regardless of age or what/where in Alaska they will hunt.
