Regionwide & Multiple Units

- **<u>F</u> Proposal 1:** Shift to later moose hunting seasons in Units 13 and 14.
- **NA Proposal 2:** Establish registration archery seasons for Dall sheep in Units 9B, 11, 13, 14A, 14B and 16. *The board took no action due to the action on proposal 4.*
- <u>NA</u> Proposal 3: Open an archery only season for Dall sheep in Units 13, 14A, 14B, and 16. *The board took no action due to the action on proposal 4.*
- **F Proposal 4:** Establish a registration hunt by bow and arrow only for Dall sheep within Units 9, 11, 13A, 13B remainder, 13C remainder, 13D remainder, 14A remainder, 14B, and 16.
- NA Proposal 5: Establish three archery registration hunts for Dall sheep in Units 9, 11, 13, 14, and 16 where there are general season hunts. *The board took no action due to the action on proposal 4.*
- <u>C</u> **Proposal 197:** Reauthorize the brown bear tag fee exemptions for the Central/Southwest Region.
- **F Proposal 198:** Eliminate bear baiting or prohibit bait stations within 50 miles of cabins.
- <u>C</u> **Proposal 7:** Increase bag limit for black bear in Units 13D and 16.
- **<u>C</u> Proposal 8:** Shorten coyote trapping season in Units 9, 13, 14B, 16, and 17.
- **F Proposal 9:** Extend the wolf trapping season in Units 13 and 16.
- **D Proposal 199:** Prohibit trapping within 50 yards of multi-use trails and trailheads in Units 13, 14, and 16. The Board deferred the proposal to the March 2022, Statewide Regulations meeting to allow stakeholders additional opportunity to meet and discuss ways to address the issue.

- <u>C</u> **Proposal 10:** Allow the harvest of beaver by bow and arrow under a trapping license with salvage requirements in Units 9, 11, 13, and 16
- **NA Proposal 11:** Add bow and arrow as legal method of take for beaver in Units 9, 11, 13, and 16. *The Board took no action based on the action on proposal 10.*

Dillingham Area Proposals – Unit 17

- <u>C</u> Proposal 200: Reauthorize the antlerless moose season in Unit 17A.
- **F Proposal 13:** Increase the number of nonresident drawing permits and extend the nonresident season by 10 days in Unit 17A.
- <u>C</u> **Proposal 14:** Establish fixed-season dates for resident registration moose hunts RM575 & RM576 in Unit 17A.
- **F Proposal 15:** Establish a registration hunt for bull moose limited to resident certified bowhunters only within Unit 17B.
- **F Proposal 16:** Establish a registration hunt for bull moose open to nonresident certified bowhunters only within Unit 17B, remainder.
- NA Proposal 17: Establish a registration hunt for bull moose limited to certified bowhunters only within Unit 17B. (*The Board took no action due to the action on proposals 15 and 16.*)

- NA Proposal 20: Establish Tier II subsistence hunting season and bag limit for the Mulchatna caribou herd (MCH). The Board took no action based on lack of population information and the ability to submit future proposals when more data is available.
- CA Proposal 21: Establish a second predation control area for Mulchatna caribou on federal lands in Game Management Units 17 and 18. The board amended the proposal with RC 47 which includes Units 17A and 18 in the intensive management plan; removes the 10,000 sq. mi. limitation to allow control to be conducted over a larger area if warranted; extends the plan until 2028; and allows department control of both wolves and bears.
- **NA Proposal 19:** Establish new population and harvest objectives for the Mulchatna caribou herd in Units 9, 17, 18, and 19. *The board took no action because it would be premature to discuss population and harvest objectives given the current information about the herd and previous board action.*
- **D** Proposal 22: Determine customary and traditional uses of the Nushagak Peninsula caribou herd in Game Management Units 17A and 17C Nushagak Peninsula, Bristol Bay. *The board deferred the proposal to the March 2022 Statewide Regulations meeting.*

- **F Proposal 201:** Allow motorized vehicles for hunting moose and caribou in the Upper Mulchatna Controlled Use Area in Unit 17B.
- CA Proposal 23: Allow the use of snowmachine to position wolf or wolverine for harvest in Unit 17. The Board amended the proposal with RC 48 as amended to remove subparagraph viii, and adding Unit 17 to subparagraph viii. The Board expressed intent to address the definition of "position" at the March 2022 Statewide Regulations meeting (see RC 59 and the additional actions).
- <u>C</u> Proposal 24: Establish a season, daily and seasonal bag limit, and salvage requirement for Alaska hare in Unit 17. *The clarified the season end date is January 31*.
- **C Proposal 202:** Allow the use of a firearm to take beaver while trapping in Unit 17.
- **C Proposal 203:** Extend the trapping season for muskrat in Unit 17.

- **F Proposal 32:** Close the nonresident season for Emperor geese in Units 9 and 10.

- <u>C</u> Proposal 86: Change the bag limit for Dall sheep in Unit 14A to full-curl ram.
- **F Proposal 87:** Change the bag limit for the Dall sheep permit hunts in Unit 14A and convert the early season to archery only permit hunts.
- **F Proposal 88:** Establish an archery only general season hunt for Dall sheep in Unit 14.
- **F Proposal 89:** Establish a registration hunt for Dall sheep open to certified bowhunters only, by longbow or recurve bow only within Unit 14A, Metal Creek area.
- **F Proposal 90:** Extend the brown bear hunting season in Units 14A and 14B.
- **NA Proposal 91:** Establish a general season by bow and arrow only for brown bear within Units 14A and 14B. *The Board took no action due to the action on proposal 90.*
- <u>CA</u> Proposal 92: Open a year-round season for brown bear in Unit 16. *The Board amended the proposal to exclude the Wolverine Creek season September 15 May 31*,
- NA Proposal 93: Open a year-round season for brown bear in Unit 16. *The Boad took no action due to the action on proposal* 92

- NA Proposal 94: Establish a general season by bow and arrow only for brown bear within Units 16A and 16B, remainder. *The Boad took no action due to the action on proposal* 92
- NA Proposal 95: Lengthen the brown bear season in Unit 16B for residents and nonresidents. *The Boad took no action due to the action on proposal* 92
- **CA Proposal 96:** Allow the take of black bear in Unit 16B the same day a hunter has flown. The board amended the proposal to apply to all of Unit 16 and exclude August 10 September 30.
- **NA Proposal 97:** Allow beaver to be taken with firearm or archery equipment in Unit 16. *The Board took no action due to the action on proposal 10.*
- <u>CA</u> **Proposal 98:** Extend the beaver trapping season in Unit 16. *The Board amended the proposal to extend the hunting season instead of the trapping season.*
- **C Proposal 229:** Lengthen the marten trapping season in Unit 14A.
- **F Proposal 99:** Close areas within Units 14A, 14B, and 16A to trapping.
- **DA Proposal 100:** Remove requirement that traps and snares for beaver be submerged in Unit 16. The Board amended the proposal to apply statewide and deferred it to the March 2022 Statewide Regulations meeting.
- **F Proposal 228:** Require trap identification tags in Units 14A, 14B, and 16.
- **F Proposal 227:** Reduce the bag limit for grouse in Unit 14A and eliminate the ruffed grouse differentiation.

Miscellaneous Actions

The board scheduled a board generated proposal based on RC 59, to be scheduled for the March 2022 Statewide Regulations Meeting. RC 59 provides a definition for "position" as it applies to using a snowmachine to take game.

The board discussed and agreed to allow the option for the public to give remote testimony by phone for the March 2022 Statewide Regulations Meeting due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
