### Pack It ALL Out!


#### Dall Sheep Meat Salvage Requirements

Your hard work has paid off with a successful sheep harvest. But your work is far from over- it's time to care for the meat. Salvage of meat means transporting the meat to the location where it will be processed for human consumption. Horns of all Dall sheep must be salvaged and while most hunting partners will carry the entire animal out of the field in one trip, Alaska State Regulations mandate that horns may ONLY be taken out of the field after the meat is packed out or transported with the final load of meat.



If you harvest a Dall sheep, you must salvage:

- All the neck meat
- All the chest meat (saddle)
- All the meat of the ribs
- Front quarters to the knee
- Hindquarters to the hock
- All the meat along the backbone (backstraps and tenderloins)

  - Solo hunters may limit distance traveled
  - Group parties may limit total sheep harvested within the group
- ❑ Not currently required for sheep in other areas.

### What you should know!

The most important part of hunting is proper meat salvage and care.

- Take full responsibility for meat care**  
Don't shoot it if you can't pack it out. It is your responsibility to keep your meat in good condition. You are encouraged to leave meat on the bone. Deboning in the field is less efficient and can contribute to an increased chance of meat spoilage.
- Keep meat cool, clean, and dry**  
Heat is the greatest threat to game meat. Game bags keep meat cool and clean while allowing the meat to dry. They also help prevent flies from laying eggs and reduce bacterial growth. Spraying meat with a mix of citric acid and water can also help prevent and reduce bacteria from growing.
- Salvage ALL usable meat**  
Butcher damage is typically minimal. If you investigate the meat around the shot, you can often salvage more meat than you may have initially thought possible. Don't waste meat.
- You may be checked in the field**  
Be prepared to show Alaska Wildlife Troopers all portions of meat that are required for salvage, whether you leave meat on the bone or not. A conviction for failing to adhere to meat salvage regulations may result in fines, jail time, loss of hunting privileges, and loss of license and more.
