RHAK PROPOSAL 112 information

It was our mistake to include nonresident military licensees in our proposal #112 to restrict all nonresident Fortymile caribou hunters from hunting along the road system. We do not want to exclude our active-duty military personnel stationed in Alaska from any part of this hunt if they are hunting under a military nonresident license.

It has come to our attention that wildlife troopers would be able to distinguish if a hunter in the field is a nonresident or a military nonresident, as it clearly shows on the hunting license if one has a military nonresident license.

We would support an amendment to exempt nonresident military licensees from any restrictions on where they can hunt the Fortymile caribou herd during the RC 860 fall hunt.
