5 AAC 92.069. Special provisions for moose drawing permit hunts.	
Most allocation between residents and nonresidents takes a different form:	
Residents = harvest ticket/registration permit Nonresidents = drawing permit	
Residents = any bull bag limit, longer season, or both Nonresidents = antler restrictions, shorter season, or both	
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Proposal 135

Allocation – 10% to Nonresidents

Allocate 10% of all drawing permits to nonresidents, if fewer than 10 permits are available, no nonresident permits will be issued

Recommendation: Neutral on Allocation Opposed to Complexity

Proposal 136 – Once in a lifetime bison and musk ox permits; applicants apply once per hunt 13

This proposal would limit a person to being able to win a bison and musk ox drawing permit hunt only once in a lifetime, and only allow applicants to apply for one drawing permit hunt for bison and one drawing permit hunt for musk ox per application period

Proposal 138

Muskox locking tags

AS 16.05.340(a) Fees for licenses, permits, and tags: (16) Resident big game tags

(B) Musk oxen, each......\$500

However, the Board of Game may, by regulation reduce or eliminate the resident big game tag and fee for musk oxen for all or a portion of a game management unit.

5 AAC 92.016. The resident tag fee for hunting musk oxen by registration permit on Nelson Island and on Nunivak Island is \$25. The Board of Game waives the resident tag fee for subsistence musk oxen hunting.

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Proposal 138

Muskox locking tags

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5 AAC 92.016. The resident tag fee for hunting musk oxen by registration permit on Nelson Island and on Nunivak Island is \$25. A resident tag is not required for taking musk oxen in subsistence hunts. The Board of Game waives the resident tag fee for subsistence musk oxen hunting.

RY24 – 73 Tier II muskox permits issued 5 year average = 54 Tier II muskox permits

One subsistence registration hunt, RX110, 26B East of the DHCMA. 4 permits issued per year.





Proposal 188 – Transfer RY24 DI403 and DI404 (Delta bison) permits that were revoked to same recipients for RY26

This proposal would allow a permittee who had their Unit 20D bison permit revoked for regulatory year 2024 to have the permit transferred to regulatory year 2026 upon request

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Additionally for consideration - absent the transfer of permits across regulatory years, the department would like the board to consider lifting the lifetime and 10-year loss of eligibility for those hunters that were awarded permits that were subsequently revoked, allowing those hunters to begin applying again.

CURRENT REGULATIONS

5 AAC 92.050(a)(4)

(H) a resident who is a successful applicant for a bison drawing permit hunt is ineligible to apply for another bison drawing permit for 10 years; a nonresident who is a successful applicant for a bison drawing permit hunt is ineligible to apply for another bison drawing permit;





If adopted this proposal would:

- Allow a permittee with a revoked RY24 Unit 20D bison permit to have that permit transferred to RY26 (upon request), *or*;
- Remove the lifetime and ten-year loss of eligibility for those permittees with revoked RY24 Unit 20D bison permits









Proposal 188 – Transfer RY24 DI403 and DI404 (Delta bison) permits that were revoked to same recipients for RY26

 If no action is taken, permit winners that had permits revoked (n = 55) will be unable to hunt, and may not have the chance again, even if allowed to reapply

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- During pandemic bear hunts were authorized to be moved to future years
 - 549 impacted hunters, 428 transferred permits
 - Original hunts were for spring of CY2020, all transferred hunts concluded by spring of CY2022
- No other species were considered

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If adopted, 5 AAC 92.050(a)(6) would therefore read:

(E) a permittee who had their Unit 20(D) bison permit revoked for regulatory year 2024 may, upon request, have the permit transferred to regulatory year 2026.

If adopted this proposal would:

- Allow a permittee with a revoked RY24 Unit 20D bison permit to have that permit transferred to RY26 (upon request), *or*;
- Remove the lifetime and ten-year loss of eligibility for those permittees with revoked RY24 Unit 20D bison permits











Proposal 189 – Transfer RY24 DI403 and DI404 (Delta bison) permits that were revoked to same recipients for RY26

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- Many hunters expressed a preference to hunt in a different year, rather than have hunt conditions drastically altered
- The department is considering advertising a more conservative number of permits in the drawing supplement, which may mitigate this issue moving forward
- Number of "new" permits for RY26 would be decreased if adopted

If permits not transferred, department requests the board to consider lifting the lifetime and 10-year loss of eligibility

Suggested new sub-subparagraph (in bold text) to 5 AAC 92.050(a)(4)(H): is as follows





(H) a resident who is a successful applicant for a bison drawing permit hunt is ineligible to apply for another bison drawing permit for 10 years; a nonresident who is a successful applicant for a bison drawing permit hunt is ineligible to apply for another bison drawing permit;
(i) however, a resident who had their Unit 20(D) bison permit revoked for regulatory year 2024 is eligible to apply for another bison drawing permit for regulatory year 2026; and a nonresident who had their Unit 20(D) bison permit revoked for regulatory year 2024 is eligible to apply for another bison drawing permit for regulatory year 2024; and a nonresident who had their Unit 20(D) bison permit revoked for regulatory year 2024 is eligible to apply for another bison drawing permit.
