However, please know that I do not come to hunt. I have not brought my family multiple times for the purpose of game hunting. Many feel the same way. Your tourist economy will hurt if you continue to destroy the apex predators that many travel to your state to see, not hunt. Please consider the larger implications in these actions and find ways to protect your environment for the long term instead of short-term gains.
