5 AAC 85.050. Hunting seasons and bag limits for musk oxen.

Limit the Non-Resident permit allocation for the Unit 18 Muskox drawing hunt DX001, to “up to” 10% of the available permits as follows:

What solution do you recommend? In other words, if the board adopted your solution, what would the new regulation say?

Limit the Non-Resident permit allocation for the Unit 18 Muskox drawing hunt DX001, to “up to” 10% of the available permits. If at least 10 permits are not available a Non-Resident permit will not be available.

What is the issue you would like the board to address and why?

Limit the number of tags that may be drawn by Non-Residents for Muskox drawing hunt DX001.

There is currently no allocation cap on how many tags may be drawn by Non-Residents.

Non-Residents are drawing a consistently high proportion of the tags for high demand drawing hunts. Muskox hunting in Alaska is the only location in North America where a Non-Resident hunter could hunt Muskox without a guide, making it a highly desirable opportunity. Meat value of a Muskox is high and obtaining Muskox permits even among local community members is difficult and both Residents and Non-Residents compete for the tags equally in the Big Game Drawing.
